Facilities, Maintenance and Grounds:

Equestrian Estates

- Installed just over a 1000 linear feet of new fencing, expected completion is October 2015. Most of
 maintenance hours other than emergency and regular maintenance issue calls were spent working
 on the arena fencing.
- Continual maintenance of the arena and turn out is being completed regularly.
- Continuing weed abatement on the 5.5 miles of equestrian trails.
- Repaired washout at our v-ditch off Indian River

Lake and Fishing Areas:

Marina/ Lake

- Fishing area 12 upgrade has started and completion is scheduled by beginning October.
- Clean up of debris around the lake that were caused from the storm.
- We received over 130 acre feet of water as water run off from this last storm, which raised the level of the lake over 6 inches. We had been lowering the lake slowing in preperation of winter storms. At the time of the storm our lake was 3.5 inces below normal. After the storm we were 3" above normal. In preperation of this years El Nino winter we are quickly lowering the lake to 12" below normal and will hold that level until El Nino has passed.
