

What a strange month of weather we had in July! We finally received some much needed rain that helped water our yards and also saved us some money filling our lake. Unfortunately, we also had a number of homes flooded and lost a few trees. I guess that's what happens when you get 10,000+ people all hoping for rain at the same time! Thanks goes to our Operations Dept. for providing sand and sand bags at the Community Building for residents. If you didn't know about this, it's probably because we don't have your email address or you don't check our other electronic media sources. Please let us know your email address in order to receive our e-Blasts when we have important information to get out to the community.

Our committees, clubs, and volunteers are constantly giving back to our community and they never cease to amaze me by what they accomplish. A recent example is the SVL Amateur Radio Club's (SVLARC) weekend licensing class held Aug. 1-2. The club conducted the two-day class for several volunteers involved in High Desert Search & Rescue activities to prepare them to take the Amateur Radio licensing exam. The "pass rate" was 100% for the class of five! Helping organizations like this help us all. This is the fifth li-

censing class conducted in SVL and has resulted in nearly 50 new "Hams" being licensed in the High Desert community since 2012. Well done SVLARC!

Hopefully you've seen the new look at our Community Building. The facelift inside and outside has really improved the look and feel of the building and is a great upgrade for our community. There's a lot of planning and coordination that goes into a project like this, and I'd like to thank the entire SVLA team for making it happen.

By year's end, we should see some significant changes around the entry into SVL as you turn north from Bear Valley Rd. and make your way into SVL. Also, Phase 1 of the county's interior road project should be well underway by year's end. The four major entry & road rehabilitation projects planned for this year are:

- CSA-64 rehab of the SVL Arch and walls along Bear Valley Rd.
- Spring Valley Parkway rehab from Bear Valley Rd. to the SVL entry border
- Completion of the median project around the SVL Archway
- SB County's Phase 1 road project for our interior roads

The completion of these projects will make a dramatic improvement to the entry into SVL and to some of our roads within our community. These projects are the result of an outstanding coordination and planning effort by your Board, staff, City of Victorville, and San Bernardino County, working with Supervisor Robert Lovingood and his staff.

A few weeks ago I was sitting in our Community Building looking out at Meadowlark Park, when I saw a plastic bag blowing across the park into the playground area. Just as I spotted the bag, so did a little 2 or 3 year old boy who, on his own with no prompting from his parents, chased down that plastic bag, picked it up, and ran over and tossed it in a trash can! He did it without any hesitation and without his parents saying a word to him.

The moral of this story is simple - if a 3 year old can pick up a piece of trash in our community

and throw it away, so can we. If you see trash in the street or in the empty lot next door, or around one of our common areas, please pick it up and throw it away. Don't wait for someone else to do it or ignore it just because you didn't put it there. It's our community, let's keep it clean. I think SVL is one of the cleanest communities in the High Desert - let's keep it that way.

The Semi-Annual Membership Meeting will be held August 22, at 10:00AM in the Community Building. This meeting is where the budget for the 2016 Fiscal Year beginning November 1, 2015, will be presented to the Board and community. The Budget will then be voted on at the Regular Board meeting on August 25, 2015. I hope you attend this important meeting.

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY



Meadowlark Park Closure

Construction for the new playground equipment (closest to the baseball field) in Meadowlark Park began 8/4/15. We started the removal and installation and expect the construction to take 30 days.

We will also be removing just under 300 tons of the sand and us-

ing it at the beach area to replenish sand loss that occurs at the beach yearly. We will be using ADA approved wood chips for the new playground area.

The other playground will remain open, but please be aware and mindful that construction will be taking place in the area.

Community Building Upgrades



The new drought resistant landscaping around the west and north

side of the building is complete. LED lights are in place to light up

the plants, palms and building. We have added a new walkway

connecting the entrance to CB4 with the other CB entrances.



At the Equestrian Estates



The Board approved the replacement of the Arena fencing using the reserve funding saved to replace this asset. The current fencing is over 25 years old and has done its part. We are now replacing the fence using a heavy duty powder coated fence that

will beautify the Equestrian Estates Arena and Barn area and allow easy modular replacement if any parts are damaged.



The installation should take less than 2 months and not interfere with normal daily use of the Arena.




What does Public Safety do?

Public Safety's number one concern is the protection of your Association amenities and to ensure that Spring Valley Lake remains a safe community for you and your family to reside in. Through patrols and deterrence of crime, public safety can also aid in protecting your property value while increasing your peace of mind. We provide the following enforce-

ment and response:

Proactive patrols; medical assistance response; residential checks; membership verification; barking/loose dog compliance; loud noise compliance; lake patrol; water rescue; suspicious activity; lost & found property and animals; garage/yard sale regulation; vessel inspections; law enforcement assistance (as needed); community surveillance; event security; issuance vessel operator permits; and much more.

When can I get a vessel operator's permit?

A. Vessel operator's permits are issued 7 days a week, 365 days a year between 9 a.m. and 10 a.m.

B. You must arrive at 9:00 a.m. as the process takes a full hour to complete.

Yacht Club Hosts Regatta

A full field of competitors turned out for the fourth annual SVL Regatta and Race for the Spring Valley Lake Cup on Saturday, July 25. Sponsored by the SVL Yacht Club, the annual event is open to all SVL residents and there is no entry fee. This year's regatta consisted of races in three classes of non-powered watercraft: a

starting next to the security dock on East Beach, rounding a buoy in front of the marina, and finishing at the corner of the swimming area wall.

Racers in the paddle class were up first. Mark Sedam finished first with a time of 2 minutes, 55 seconds, followed not long after by Efrain Arroyo in second place and Diley Greiser in third. In the peddle class, Ryan Lewis

contested race. With a time of 2:50, Sean Arnold crossed the finish line first, followed by Austin O'Bier and Rick Arringdale.

An awards ceremony followed the last race. Trophies were presented to the top three finishers in each class, then the Spring Valley Lake Cup (which is SVL's equivalent of the America's Cup) was

presented to the top racer. Because no one placed in more than one race, the designation of the SVL Cup recipient came down to the best overall time. With a time of 2:35 in the peddle class, it was Ryan Lewis who received the top award, and who will be the person to beat in the fifth annual SVL Regatta to be held next year.




