It's easy to sometimes get lost in the day-to-day details of what's going on in SVL, so it's a good time to step back and look at how we are ending the 2015 calendar year.

In a nutshell – we're in very good overall shape by nearly every measure you could use to evaluate our Association - financial strength, collections, public safety, community improvement projects, and property values.

Financial Strength – We end 2015 with over \$1.3M in our Reserve Account, which is up from \$950K in Dec. 2014 – a 37% increase. The current Reserve Account level represents a respectable 56% funding level, which your Board feels is a strong position for an HOA like SVLA.

Collections – The total amount of delinquent assessments are down 30% from 2 years ago and delinquent assessments are at the lowest level in many years. Collections continue on a very positive trend and we expect to see continued improvement in this area. These funds represent past-due annual assessments that are unavailable for operating and improving SVLA until they are collected.

Public Safety – We end 2015 again as a very safe community in which to live, with our crime rate being among the lowest in the High Desert. Our top-notch professional Public Safety Dept., along with great support from our Sheriff Dept., CHP, County Fire, and COPs continues to serve our community well. Our Public Safety officers routinely go above-and-beyond - whether it be medical aid, broken sprinklers or missing pets.

Community Projects – Many improvement projects are underway or completed in 2016. The Parkway median landscaping, Interior roads (Phase 1), Community Center remodel & landscape, Meadowlark Park playground equipment, Fishing Area Upgrades, EE Arena & Storage area, and the Spring Valley Parkway road project are a few examples of improvements to our community this year. Repair work has also finally begun on several high-visibility community eyesores, which will help to improve the look of our community in the coming months.

Home Values – According to Coldwell Banker, the average sales price in SVL for September 2015 increased 7% compared

to September 2014. SVL had the second highest increase for that period in the High Desert area, with only Oak Hills being higher. These results show that SVL is a desirable place to live and raise a family, and homebuyers want to make SVL their home.

In summary, SVLA staff and your Board have been working hard this past year to make SVL a great place to live and to keep it the “Jewel of the High Desert”. I believe we have made significant progress towards that goal and with your help, we will continue to make progress in 2016.

I hope everyone had a very nice Thanksgiving and that things slowed down a bit so everyone could give thanks to the good things in our lives. As you all know, we have many things to be thankful for living in Spring Valley Lake, but being around family and friends in our wonderful community tops my list. We had a lot

to be thankful for in 2015, and I believe 2016 will be even better.



We are carefully removing the old play ground system as SVLA has donated it to a local school.





Doorstep Thieves - by Lt. Lisa Hartley



During this time of year, a lot of residents will be ordering items online and having them shipped to their homes. This is a prime opportunity for thieves to steal packages from your doorstep or porch. Thieves can follow delivery trucks, watching for prime targets. These thieves commonly strike during working hours as many homes are empty at that time.



To help avoid this situation, when possible, have your pack-


ages delivered to a location where they can be received in person, such as a neighbor's or relative's house. If your employer allows it, consider having your package delivered at work. When possible, request the delivery company to hold your package at their closest pick-up facility until you can pick it up. You also can ask the shipper to require a signature confirmation of delivery in order to prevent packages being left out when no one is home to sign for them. It also is helpful to provide delivery instructions so packages can be left out of sight from your yard or the road. Keep an eye on the package's delivery status so that you know when to expect it (then you can either be home or leave a note for the delivery person to deliver it to a neighbor). If friends/relatives are sending you something, ask them to send you the tracking number. Just to be safe, have your package insured. 💎

Reconstruction of Spring Valley Parkway

On Friday November 20, 2015, the City of Victorville hosted a groundbreaking ceremony for the reconstruction of Spring Valley Parkway. The work is scheduled to begin as early as November 30 and extend through December. This project is focusing on reconstructing Spring Valley Parkway between Bear Valley and Huerta Roads. The road will be resurfaced and sealed along with installing ADA-compliant sidewalks, curbs and ramps.

The County of San Bernardino, Spring Valley Lake Association and the City of Victorville all contributed to this project which will greatly improve Spring Valley Parkway.

During this time traffic will be reduced to one lane in each direction and pedestrian paths may be re-routed while the new sidewalks are being installed. Due to the construction drivers are encouraged to use alternate routes via Tamarisk and Ridgecrest to avoid any congestion at the construction area.

Guidelines for visitors



- **Don't scare the horses!** No running, loud noises or scary objects (such as balloons or noisy toys) around the barn. If a horse acts alarmed, stop, stand still and lower your hands.

- **Always speak to a horse and quietly get his attention before touching him.** Horses sometimes doze on their feet, and you could startle one and make him jump if you surprise him.

- **Stay out of the horse's blind spots.** A horse can't see what's directly behind him, underneath his head and belly, and right under the end of his nose. Don't duck under the neck (or belly!) of a horse when he's tied up—this can startle him.

- **Stay in the safety zone,** which is near the horse's neck and shoulder. If you go behind a horse, stay out of kicking range. Don't stand directly in front of a horse: He might toss his head and bump you.

- **Watch out for your feet.** A horse weighs about half a ton and he doesn't look where he steps. When leading, walk beside the horse's neck, not close to his feet.

- **Don't go into a pasture or stall with a horse unless the owner is with you.** Farm machinery, haylofts and some places around the barn are also off limits because they aren't safe for visitors.

- **Leave all gates and doors closed.** A gate left open can let a horse get loose and into serious trouble.

- **Supervise children closely whenever horses are near.** Do not allow kids to go to the barn or pasture without an adult who is experienced with horses.




The 1st Annual Veterans Banquet


