NEWSLETTER POLICY

INTRODUCTION

The Spring Valley Lake Association (“Association”) publishes a community newspaper, ‘The SVLA Breeze’ each month (“Newsletter”) that is an important resource to inform members of upcoming events, local association news, homeowner-interest articles, and advertisements for local businesses and services. The Newsletter is printed, mailed and received by residents on a monthly basis. In addition, all monthly issues of the Newsletter are posted on the Association website for members to access.

The Association’s editor/media coordinator shall be in charge of the communications and content of the monthly newsletter, and will ensure that the content is proper, pending management approval. Any uncertainties shall be resolved with the assistance of the Association’s General Manager and/or the President of the Board.

NEWSLETTER STANDARDS

The Association’s editor/media coordinator shall be in charge of publishing the monthly Newsletter, and will use their best judgment, along with the guidelines provided in the Policy, when determining the nature of communications which are proper for inclusion in the Newsletter. Any uncertainties in carrying out the duties described herein shall be resolved with the assistance of the Association’s General Manager and/or the President of the Board.

The following rules apply to any content of the Newsletter (i.e., announcements, articles, advertisements, and other communications):

1. The information should pertain solely to the interests that the recipients/readers have as members and residents of the Association.
2. The information shall not contain any personal attacks against, or criticisms of, any person affiliated with the Association, including but not limited to members of the Association’s management, Board, or Committees.
3. The information shall not contain any information which is political in nature, or which communicates or expresses an opinion or position regarding any pending Association ballot

measure (i.e., any pending Director election), unless published as a candidate statements or ad space purchased for campaign purposes.

SUBMISSIONS

The Association’s editor/media coordinator and General Manager have sole discretion with regard to the content of the Newsletter. Approval submissions must be received by the deadline date (the 1st of each month) to be included in the Newsletter.

1. Articles, announcements, reports, flyers and such should be submitted via email to: info@svla.com. Acceptable file formats are Word docs, pdf, and jpg; otherwise call for verification.
2. Photos and artwork submissions should be camera ready and emailed as attachments to: info@svla.com by the deadline date.



MAINTENANCE, REPAIR & OPERATIONS

Hello SVLA residents! Maintenance is currently working on finalizing a few projects throughout this beautiful community, like the water filtration systems located at fishing areas #1, #7, #9 and #14. These systems are around 70% complete at



this time. Maintenance still needs to build covers, double doors and run intake and discharge lines out to the main lake from the containment areas. We are hoping to have these systems fully operational within 2-3 weeks.



OUR LAKE



In-regards to the quality of the lake, the current overall average secchi disk reading is 1' 5". The average DO is 12.5 and saturation is 120%. Lake debris removal is still scheduled on a weekly basis. As many of you are aware, there will be 1 more fish stocking, which will be on February 11, 2020.

At the Community Center, Maintenance has been pruning trees. Once the designated trees have been pruned, maintenance will then proceed to the west and east beach. We will continue throughout the year working on the fishing area trees as well.

Equestrian Estates

At the equestrian center, we have been working on refurbishing the exterior restrooms by the main barn. Maintenance has installed new flooring, toilets, sinks, light-



ing, new roofing, orange peel texture, baseboards and a fresh coat of paint. The restrooms will be finalized in 1-2 weeks.



The equestrian center also had 2 magnetic barrier arm gates installed. One arm barrier gate was installed on Shetland road where it is an entrance only, and the other by Appaloosa Rd which is



an exit only. Maintenance also installed 440 fencing by the arm barriers to close the open areas. There is a manual gate located by the exit barrier arm in case a rider needs to enter or exit the area.

We are keeping busy around the community. Don't forget, if you ever notice a Maintenance related issue around the community, call the Association Office and we will do our best to get it corrected.

WHY I OPPOSE CREATING A NEW COMMUNITY SERVICE DISTRICT AND YOU SHOULD TOO

A group of Spring Valley Lake residents has recently proposed creating a new Community Service District to replace the County-operated Community Service Area 64 that provides our community with governmental services, including administration, sewer, water and trash collection. In considering this proposed change registered voters living in Spring Valley Lake should take into consideration the following issues:

- **Increased Costs of Operation** – Creating an entirely new government entity to oversee Spring Valley Lake will require a significant outlay of salaries for administrators and staff. At minimum, a General Manager (estimated salary \$ 150,000 plus \$ 60,000 in benefits), Water Manager (\$100,000 + \$ 40,000), Sewer Manager (\$ 100,000 + \$ 40,000) and nine administrative staff at a total estimated annual cost of \$ 630,000 would be required in order to provide services that are already provided by San Bernardino County at a much lower cost. Moreover, because these would all be new employees, a steep learning curve would be required in order for these workers to familiarize themselves with the issues and concerns affecting our community.
- **Higher Water, Sewer and Garbage Rates** – Based on my research Spring Valley Lake currently has among the lowest monthly water rates of any community in the High Desert. Our sewer and garbage rates are similarly competitive. It is highly unlikely that an investment on the order of over \$ 1 million annually in salaries and benefits will result in lower utility rates; in fact, water, sewer and garbage rates would likely *increase* under the proposed CSD.
- **Other Issues are More Important** – Long-needed repairs to our lake and the impending possible sale of the Spring Valley Lake Country Club by its current owner, ClubCorp, are far more important issues confronting our community than replacing an already well-functioning administrative structure.
- **There is Nothing Wrong with the Current Structure** – The proposed Community Services District is a solution in search of a problem. The existing CSA 64 has served our community well. They respond quickly to customer inquiries and manage our affairs efficiently. 95 percent of our roads are currently being repaved at a cost of \$ 12.4 million in State dollars in an initiative that was facilitated by the County Public Works Director. As stated earlier, our water, sewer, and garbage rates are reasonable in comparison with other High Desert communities.
