

Is Anybody Listening?

Have you ever heard a homeowner speak passionately about an issue at a Board meeting and notice that the Board does not even discuss the issue? What is going on?

If homeowners wish to discuss items that are not on the agenda, they may submit a comment card and speak during the Homeowner's Open Forum. Unfortunately, the Board's ability to address the homeowner's comment is limited by statute. CA Civil Code Section 4930(b) states that Boards may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed, ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on the board member's own activities.

The limitation preventing the Board from discussing non-agenda items is frustrating for the Board as well as for homeowners. One way the Board has tried to demonstrate that it is listening to homeowners' comments is to place items that have been raised in the Homeowner's Open Forum on the following month's agenda so that the items can be discussed.

The purpose of posting agendas prior to the meeting is to give homeowners notice of what is going to be discussed, so homeowners can be present at the meeting if they are interested. If an issue is on the agenda for an Open Board

Meeting, homeowners can submit a comment card and talk about that item when it comes up on the agenda. The Board is able to discuss comments and questions that address items that are on the agenda.

Usually when homeowners speak during Homeowner's Open Forum, the General Manager, as well as the Directors of Operations, Administration and Public Safety, make notes of individual homeowner issues so they can work to resolve them. The General Manager frequently encourages homeowners to contact him outside the meeting so he can discuss issues in more detail.

The Board of Directors does like to hear comments, concerns and suggestions from homeowners. In addition to attending Board meetings, homeowners can give input by attending Town Hall sessions on particular issues, responding to survey requests, reviewing drafts of rules or guidelines, participating on committees, attending the annual budget meeting or sending an email to Board@svla.com.

The Board and the Association Team are listening. We hope that the community is "listening" to information in the Breeze, on the SVLA Facebook, on Twitter, on the website, and in the e-blasts. Thank you for listening. 💎

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Of the normal routine maintenance items our crews take care of, we have also diligently been working on the beach and marina areas, getting them ready for this summer season that is already upon us. There has been an increased usage of the beach area due to the reconditioning project happening at Meadowlark Park. We have already held 3 large events at the beach starting with the Easter Egg hunt, Family Campout and Summer Kick off and concert. All were very well attended, which adds to the maintenance requirements at the beach. In addition to this, we have some key items of interest at the beach.

We are trying some new sand that I have a lake committee member introduced me to. It is a plaster select sand that is lighter and does not hold as much heat as the washed plaster sand we are currently using. We have placed 50 tons on the east beach lake edge side and around the swim area water's edge. Although it is more susceptible to being blown by the wind when dry due to its light characteristics, we haven't noticed it blowing away so far.

We have trimmed all 21 trees at the east and west beach areas

along with over 35 trees around our lake and EQ communities.

We are still working on the marina docks, repairing and painting all of the slips we have. We have hydro seeded FA 1 to cover up some bare spots. So, FA 1 is barricaded off and the sprinklers are turning on 4 times per day to get the grass started. We will open it back up in time for the firework show. Thank you for your patience during this time.

At the EQ, we have started the gazebo replacement project; upgrading the corner of Indian River Dr. and Shetland Dr. which includes 2 cedar gazebo picnic areas, a horse statue, and some landscaping with drought tolerant plants lighting, trees and hydro seed. You will see some information and pictures of the progress there at the EQ on our facebook page. Please check it out if you are interested.

The Meadowlark Park reconditioning project is in its 3rd month and on schedule to complete in October. Most of the off leash dog park area is installed and all the grading is complete. The ball field has been cut in and ready for the clay. We will be installing the new irrigation system next.

We will also be closing the front parking area down to modify and improve the front entrance. The parking area will meet current ADA requirements. We will be sending out an email blast and posting it on facebook to advise when this will be taking place.

OUR LAKE



We have contacted our lake consultant regarding our lake and the brown coloring we are experiencing. This coloring is different from the usual issue we see when the lake flips. We have confirmed that this is a diatom bloom and identified this bloom with cell counts higher than 100,000 cells/L. We are now getting proposals from our consultant and others for a algaecide treatment to kill off this bloom. This bloom is also expected to die off as the lake temps rise and its nutrient food source is depleted. I will explain this in my article, but first I want to answer the number 1 question; Are They Harmful? The answer is highly publicized, but I will use this answer from a UAEX publication FSA-9094, where it states *"In sportfish ponds and commercial aquaculture ponds, moderate levels of algae are beneficial. They serve as the base of the food chain and also take up ammonia, a waste product of fish. However, algae also changes the appearance of water bodies."* *"The various forms and types of algae are rarely directly harmful."* Algae is an important base to our food chain here at our lake. The publi-


cation goes on to say *"In general, the major negative effects of algae occur indirectly. Excessive algae growth can lead to a lack of dissolved oxygen in the water. As plants, algae produce oxygen through photosynthesis, but they also consume oxygen through the process of respiration. Respiration of heavy blooms of algae on warm summer nights or during prolonged periods of cloudy weather can reduce dissolved oxygen levels to dangerously low levels, low enough to kill fish. Dense algae blooms or scums may also die suddenly, again resulting in low dissolved oxygen concentrations. Decomposition of blooms can reduce dissolved oxygen levels and result in fish kills."* This bloom, although unsightly, is not harmful to us. We do monitor dissolved oxygen (DO) levels due to its importance to our eco system. We have good DO levels throughout the year, even at the bottom of the lake where DO levels are typically lower. We hold levels above 6.2 consistently. I want to also throw out there that 70 to 80 percent of the earths oxygen is produced by algae. But back to removing its food source... In April, SVL did the Alum treatment that removes these nutrients from the water; these nutrients being Phosphorous and Nitrate. This chart shows us that the Alum is still binding to the Phosphorous and that is why the number is still dropping. With

this removal of nutrients, we are expecting to see the bloom die off. We are testing the water to verify if the diatom bloom cell count is lowering. I have attached a chart I made showing the food chain we have in our lake that we monitor and maintain for balance. If you would like to see more information regarding our lake, you can find it online at www.slva.com, click on Amenities tab, then scroll down to Lake. At the bottom of that page is a tab for lake management, you can read the data under our consultant tab Aquatechnex data. We are also working closely with the lake committee and we have some new members on the committee that will be focusing on the issues in our lake

with a mission to create a long standing plan of action to present to the board. If you are interested in joining the committee or just want to hear about their direction, please join at the at the Community Center the 2nd Wednesday of each month. They will also be focusing on community awareness regarding pollution and runoff that is also effecting the quality of our lake. Also set your calendars for our bi-weekly beach closures for chlorine treatment. We will be closing the beach early on Wednesdays at 4pm on the following dates: June 20, June 27, July 11, July 25, Aug 8, Aug 22 and Sept 5. 

FIREWORKS SHOW

This year the firework show will be on June 30, 2018. Spring Valley Lake member ID cards and guest passes will be required for everyone 12 years of age and older that is attending the event. The Public Safety department will have a large presence of officers to ensure a safe event for all the residents. We have contacted the Sheriff Department, Fire Department, California Highway Patrol and volunteer forces for their assistance during the event. The beach area will open at 6AM; **NO one will be allowed to access the area before that time.** Please remember that you cannot save a spot and that it is against the Rules and Regulations to leave your items unattended. 💎

Other important information to remember:

- 6:00PM the Public Safety Department will enforce the “no wake” rule on the entire lake.
- 7:00PM the Public Safety Department will stop launching vessels at the boat ramp.
- 8:00PM there will be “no activity” on the lake. All vessels must be beached or on the north end of the lake.
- Per the Fire Marshal, after the firework show is over, there will be “no activity” on the lake until the lake siren has sounded the all clear.



With the warm weather coming we want to make sure all residents know that **ABOVE** ground pools **are not** allowed in Spring Valley Lake. If it is larger than a 15 gallon kiddie pool, we will be asking you to take it down. Along with the above ground pool issue, we see window air conditioners, and swamp coolers appear. Please remember before you install either one you **MUST** submit an Architectural Project Application. While we are talking about warm weather issues, we want to mention that sun shades/covers and easy ups **ARE NOT** allowed on the docks. They are allowed on patios and decks from April 1st until November 1st.

Inspection of your Palm Trees will begin June 1st. We've already noticed that many of you have begun to trim the dead fronds off already, and we ap-

preciate that. It keeps the trees healthy when the dead leaves have been trimmed off, and it keeps the rodents & insects out of them also. If your trees are not trimmed, start calling for your appointments soon.



We just want to give residents in the Equestrian Estates a heads up on the fences. When you want to install your own fence, you cannot remove the three rail fence that is present. You may put yours right inside that fence, but the three rail **must** stay. If you are not adding a fence, you are to care for and maintain that fence. We have also seen people putting chicken & other forms of wire on the back fencing. Please be aware that this is not **ALLOWED**. Should you want to add some sort of screening to the fencing, you must submit an Architectural Application to the Architectural Committee for approval.
