Living in the "Jewel of the Desert" is certainly something to be thankful for. Our lake, parks and country club all create a very special place that is like nowhere else in the High Desert.

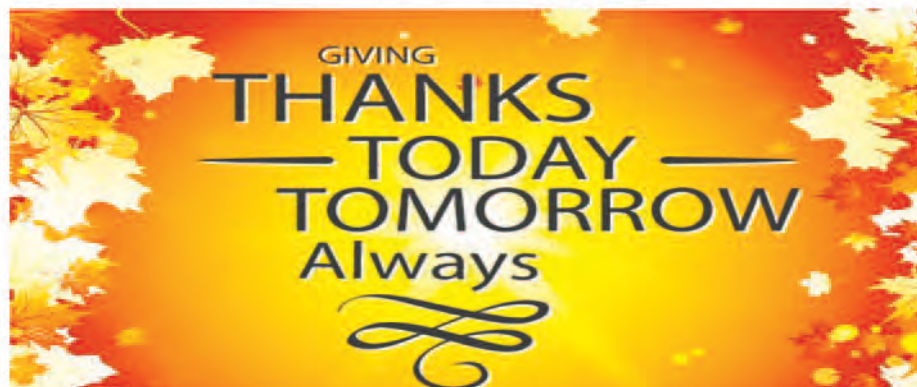
Community is a word often used to describe a group of people living in the same location; but community is so much

If you make an appointment, our team will have your property information available and will have had the opportunity to review your property file / account details.

Appointments can be made by e-mail, on SVLA.com or by phone, as desired. We will send out more information on how to make appointments. I believe this change will mean that you will notice a difference in the service you receive. We look forward to your feedback.

PSD HOLIDAY PACKAGE SERVICE

The holiday season is quickly approaching. Along with all the festivities and cheer that take place during these last few months of the year, there is also an increase in the number of residents who are buying gifts online and having them delivered to their homes. Unfortunately, this means that thieves now have ample opportunity to steal your packages that have been left out. To try and deter this behavior, it is essential to take precautionary steps to ensure your property is safe. If you have ordered a package and it is being delivered while you are away from home, try to contact the delivery company and request to pick it up at an authorized facility; or if possible, have it delivered on a different date. If the delivery company cannot accommodate your request, try asking a neighbor, a friend, or a family member to pick

up the package for you once it is delivered to your front door. If you have exhausted all other options, but you still need assistance, call the Public Safety Department at (760-245-6400) and our staff can provide, as an extra service, assistance by moving your package to a discrete location on your property. A Public Safety Officer will attempt to better conceal your package from the general view of the public or, as a last resort, the officer will bring the package to the Community Building where it can be picked up by the owner. Please keep in mind that this option is an absolute last resort as the Public Safety Department does not have the room to hold your packages for more than 24 hours. It is also important to note that if the package size is too large for a Public Safety Officer to move safely, we will be unable to accommodate your request. If you are having us hold a package for you, know that you will be required to show your picture ID to retrieve it and it will only be released to the individual that the package is addressed to. This is a special courtesy that the Association is only providing during the holiday season and we will not be responsible for any damages that might occur.

My husband served 5 years in the US Army, most of them in Europe and the Middle East, and we have been married for almost 10 years now.

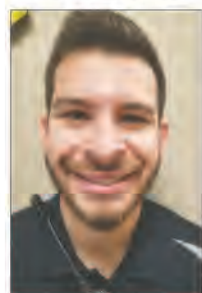

"What's going on with the roads?" is a question we hear quite often. As you may have seen, lots of construction is taking place. The streets are governed by Country and all questions and inquiries are best answered by contacting the county directly. They can be reached by phone at (909) 387-7920. The end goal is to have every street in Spring Valley Lake repaved, drainage corrections made and ADA ramps installed in various locations. This is a very large project and in the middle of it all it may seem like chaos, but this too shall pass.

The team understands some of the difficulties that may take place during this time of construction, but please be advised the Rules and Regulations have not changed. Be mindful of parking on approved surfaces only and not leaving your trash cans in public view longer than 24hrs after scheduled pickup. The code enforcement team has received lots of calls and emails regarding these items.

Alongside other changes taking

place, the Architectural department has some of their own. In efforts to effectively assist with architectural project applications, inspections, and inquiries, the architectural liaison will be available by appointment only starting February 1, 2020. There will be various ways to set up appointments and will be provided when the time is near.

Recently there has been a surge of owners unaware that architectural applications are required for all exterior modifications. This includes, but is not limited to, changes to landscape, paint, roofing, fencing etc.... The application is quite simple and only takes a few minutes to complete.

What is the SVL-CSD?

The Spring Valley Lake Community Service District (known as the SVL-CSD) is a proposed governing body that, once ratified by the voters in the local service area, will manage certain services currently managed by County Service Area 64 (known as CSA-64).

Is the SVL-CSD connected to the Spring Valley Lake Association or the SVLA Board of Directors?

The SVL-CSD has **nothing at all** to do with the Spring Valley Lake Association or the SVLA Board of Directors. It is a completely separate entity created to replace County managed CSA-64, putting the management of these services in the hands of our local elected officials.

Why should we vote to change from CSA-64 to a CSD?

Currently, our tax dollars and service fees are being managed by CSA-64 which is comprised of people, outside of our service area, who may not have a vested interest in our community. We believe it is in our best interest to elect local candidates who will sit on a Board and make decisions based upon local need. This will allow our money to be spent in areas that will directly benefit the residents within our service area and not filter into a budget line item which supports multiple CSA's within the County of San Bernardino.

How can I help make this vision a reality?

We encourage your support by voting "YES" to approve the formation of the Spring Valley Lake CSD on the November 2020 ballot. We also encourage you to share this information with your family, friends and neighbors who live within the proposed service area. 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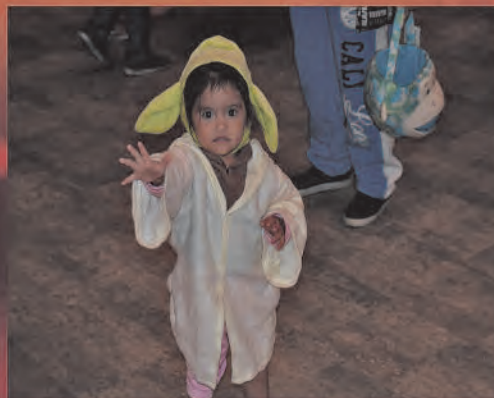

The concept came out of an idea to rent one's apartment for a weekend without all the amenities or furniture. The idea took hold in that area and the Airbnb was born.

What do the letters mean: "Air" suggests you bring an air mattress to sleep on and "bnb" is a take from bed and breakfast. The two guys who came up with the idea expanded their "weekend" suggestion to full vacation times. In my search, I learned that the online search for an Airbnb is a very lucrative business and those people who want to utilize their homes in this way are closely scrutinized. So, if complaints are made to the online service, that property owner is pulled from the very vast list of availability. Online advertisement and search are what most people do these days, so being a good vendor for the Airbnb is crucial.

Why are these facts important to note in our community publication? Because, there are Airbnb homes here in Spring Valley Lake. That said, there are a few pluses.

The properties of these Airbnb's are well kept and rules are followed. You can research online for addresses and see for yourself how well maintained the properties are. That is one plus. The other plus is if neighbors complain of loud noises, especially after or before the curfew time rules set for our community, you can report that to our Public Safety and also send a complaint to the online Airbnb company. There is a third plus to all of this: If you are planning a family reunion and there are (say) six plus family members coming in from a long way away, they can all remain under one roof, prepare meals and visit together which cannot be done in a hotel setting. Some members in SVL have taken advantage of a reunion Airbnb with positive outcomes, including the cost to family members. While we do not want to become the capital Airbnb community, perhaps our fears can be lessened just a bit with a few facts until talking points become necessary.

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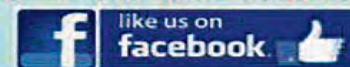

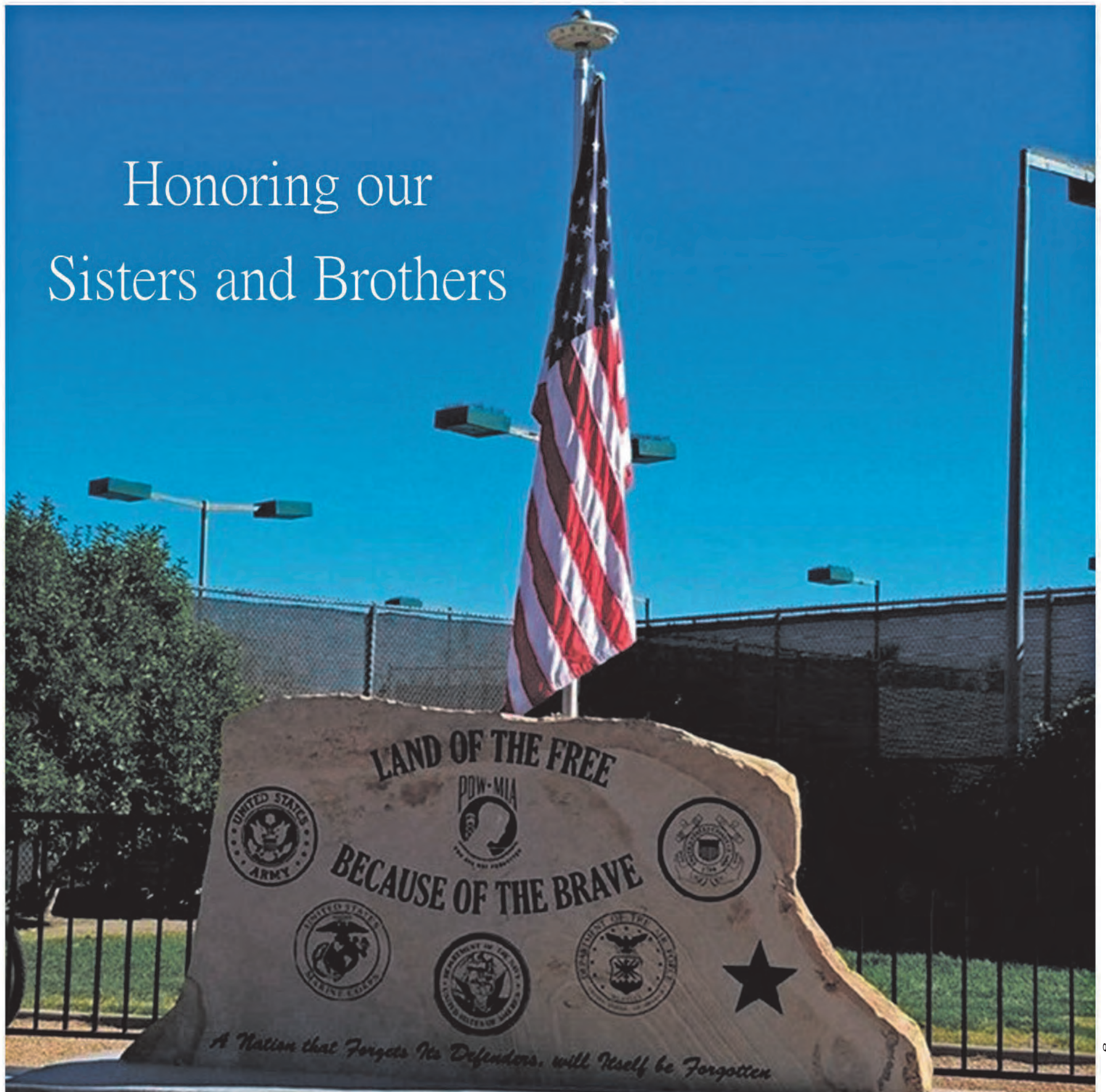
