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WITHIN 5-7 WORKING DAYS**

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As many of us in the community have observed, there has been a surge of weeds sprouting all over Spring Valley Lake due to all the recent rainfall. With more rain on its way, we must ensure we take care of the issue sooner rather than later. As a friendly reminder, spraying them is a great way to kill off those pesky weeds and also prevent new ones from sprouting; but please be sure to remove the dead weeds after being sprayed.



It is really important that homeowners with tenants submit all of the required documentation. This includes a crime free lease addendum and a dwelling license obtained from San Bernardino County. The dwelling license is to be renewed every year. If you need to submit your updated license you can stop by the Association office anytime to drop it off. We cannot stress the homeowner's responsibilities enough when it comes to having tenants. Aside from door hangers, any code enforcement issues will be mailed directly to the



home owner even if the property is tenant occupied. So please notify your tenants of the rules and regulations to prevent any misunderstandings.

In reference to the **Architectural Policy and Procedure section 10.3** - *Large items including but not limited to trash receptacles, tools, equipment, etc. shall be screened or removed from view. Trash receptacles shall not be put at the curb more than one day prior to trash collection day. All receptacles shall be removed from the curb by the next day following trash pick-up.*

We receive many questions regarding this rule. As long as the item(s) as listed previously are visible from the street it is in violation. Some recommendations for storing such items include placing it behind a gate, in the garage or simply in the backyard.

For every first offense violation (excluding starting construction without an approval) there are steps before it turns into a fine which is as follows:

- First a violation is observed by an officer or a complaint is received. At this time, a door hanger may be issued for violations that require no more than a couple days to correct or a cour-



tesy notice is mailed to you.

- Once notice is received, a door hanger violation will be inspected in two days while the courtesy letter has an inspection date underlined on the first page. Please be advised: If an extension is needed to correct the violation, you must contact Code enforcement to inform us and request the extension.

- On or following the inspection date an officer will perform an inspection. If corrections are made and the property is in compliance, a thank you card will be sent to the property owner. If corrections are not complete, a citation notification letter will be sent.

- A citation notification letter has important information including deadline dates to appeal. (A personal appearance or written appeal is required to avoid

a fine) Unchallenged violations go to the Citation Review Committee (CRC) as uncontested and are ruled "Liable as charged" with a recommended fine.

- The Board of Directors (BOD) reviews these citations and the recommendations from the CRC and address accordingly. Based on the BOD decision, a determination letter will be sent and a fine attached to the property owner's account.

- If a determination letter is received, you may appeal to the BOD if you have any objections to the notice. More information regarding the appeal process is listed on the notification.

With so many options to comply leading up to the determination letter, we would rather send owners thank you cards and keep the community looking great. But we need your help!

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Hope your having a great March, our team has been working on a few projects this month as well as our normal maintenance duties.

Equestrian Estates

We are working this year on some improvements at our Equestrian center. As we just finished upgrading our temp stall with enclosed shelter, we are also getting ready to start a few projects that the Equestrian Estates committee presented to the board for this year: Adding trees, a shade structure and picnic table near the turn-out arenas, also misters in the barn which are scheduled to start in spring.

Members Lounge

We have experience a couple delays, but are finally ready to open

this lounge that will be available for use by any member or guest per our rules. I would like to give a Big Thanks to the Planning Committee for starting this process and bringing this to fruition. I appreciate their help with this project. Also, to the Coffee break club, for their ideas and donation of books for the room that are free to use or keep. This room will comfortably seat 8 people, will offer water, hot and cold, a Keurig machine and a variety of K-cups for sale through vending machines at a cost of 50 cents each. You can check out chess pieces or checkers to play from PSD dispatch. We hope you get to enjoy this amenity.

Meadowlark Park Project

We are on schedule with phase 2 as all the grading and irrigation is

complete. The walking trails have been started and we plan to hydro seed this month.

Marina Picnic Area

We have started this upgrade that will include approx. 11,000 sq. feet of paving stones at the water's edge, creating a flat area to sit or walk along the water edge




at the marina. We tried to save the last large tree, but we could not. So that this area would be in compliance of ADA codes, we also had to remove 8 inches of soil to level this area to be in compliance. This area will include new shaded picnic areas, drinking fountains, and replacement trees. We look forward to having this area ready for our arriving warm weather.

We have had our teams working

diligently to get these first set of priority lake liner issues repaired. We have been hard at work between all the rain and freezing temps both affecting our concrete repairs. Although we have been working to overcome these weather challenges, we find that we are still behind schedule, which will affect the lake returning to normal level. Our postponement puts the lake back to normal level by April 19. Again, we appreciate your understanding and patience during these repairs. I would also like to thank the Lake Committee for their hard work and passion to address the current lake issues. Their

determination and dedication to address the issues and clear up the lake needs to be commended. I appreciate the team effort and also the dedication and commitment from the Board on everything that is going on. These volunteers are working hard for your community. 
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LAKE LOWERING & LINER REPAIR

- **The lake lowering began on January 15, 2019.**
- **The lake will be at it's lowest level by February 15th and we will begin our lake liner repairs on February 19th.**
- **The lake will be lowered a total of approximately 24" which will expose 8 feet of shoreline.**
- **We have advised that any boats tied to docks or on a lift be removed, and any floating docks be disconnected. If you choose to leave your vessel and/or floating dock, be aware that you are doing so at your own risk.**
- **If you plan to do any work to your docks or walls, please submit an architectural application to the Association Office.**





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
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VALENTINE'S 50'S DANCE
