NEW ACCOUNTING & ASSESSMENT BILLING SERVICES



Spring Valley Lake Association will no longer be using ProActive Professional Management. We have partnered with Consortium for accounting services. Service began on September 1st and will include assessment billing starting with the November 1st assessment. A welcome packet was recently sent out to all homeowners introducing Consortium, which included owner online login registration, a form for updating owner contact information and an EFT Application. If you did not receive your welcome packet in the mail, you can pick a copy up at the Association Office.

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

We are headed into some busy months with so many fall and winter events coming up. Starting us off is the Hoedown event, which will have already taken place with nearly 275 guests in attendance. We are excited to see you at all of these events.

I will be talking about some of the work maintenance has been doing this past month, before I move onto some of the items we will be working on.

Equestrian Estates

With an average of 25 horses being boarded every month at our stables, we are happy to see full capacity. This requires our guys to cover those duties involved in boarding a horse which include, feeding, watering and mucking the stalls, as well as maintaining these facilities and over 41 acres of trails. We have removed some dead trees and replaced them with new young trees. We have completed installing new gates allowing access to the gazebo area.



Lake Side

We have installed some benches in front of our community Center which are getting a lot of use from students that get picked up at the



Community Center. We have installed the new glass double doors for the New member lounge being created in the Community Center; and have been busy working on the plumbing and electrical for the sink and Keurig machine. We will also install enough outlets to charge your devices wherever you sit in this room. Look for picture updates on our facebook page over the next couple months. Like our page and hit the notification to keep up to date on info from our staff. Our facebook page is Spring Valley Lake Association.

MLP Project

We are excited to open the phase 1 portion on November 1. This

park is a multi-phase project, but we will have a portion of the walking trail open, 1 ball field complete and 9 picnic areas as well as our off leash dog park done. We are also excited to roll right into phase 2 that will complete the walking trails, exercise pads, ball fields, and outline the pump track and skate park area. We are on budget and on sched-

ule. This project has been in the works for many years with combined efforts from the Planning Committee, The SVLA Board of Directors and the community. It's great to see this come into reality; improving our assets. We have many improvements happening and planned throughout our entire community and we welcome your suggestions and comments.



OUR LAKE



We just finished our water year and wanted to share where we stand this year in water use. As you may know, we have water flow that is known as the Verde group and starts at the California DFG fish hatchery. This flows through into the Country Club then into our lake. We add fresh well water into the flow from our 13 wells that pump fresh water into our lake. The flow then goes into the Mojave Narrows park and onto Kemper Campbell Ranch before finally returning into the Mojave river. We pumped

818,730,000 gallons of fresh well water. We received 905,590,000 gallons of water from the Country Club; 905,370,000 gallons flowed out to Mojave Narrows Park. This means that we used 818,950,000 gallons or 2,513.27 acre feet of water that has evaporated in the atmosphere and/or percolated back into the ground. We have 2,261 acre feet of FPA which requires us to lease replacement water for the difference of 252 acre feet of water this year. We lease water from local water rights owners that do not

use the water at a savings of over 24% of what would cost us to pay Mojave Watermaster for the replacement water. This year’s water replacement would be around \$111,000, but we will not know the exact price until Watermaster releases this years rates in Spring of 2019. This amount is within our target budget.

Of all the data, we track we also track these for the year:

Avg. High Temp.	78.34

We will be updating and repairing all the solar lights on the buoys on the lake and checking the anchoring as we seem to have a lot more stray buoys this past summer than usual.

This year we have seen the impact of an algae bloom in our lake as well as the negative effects experienced from just the appearance of the water in our lake from this algae bloom. We are continuing to experience this diatom bloom (brown algae). Just as lakes throughout the Western United States are seeing harmful algae blooms caused from Blue-green algae-anatoxins that close their lakes, we are experiencing a brown algae that is feeding on our high nutrient water. As we work together with the Lake Committee, our maintenance team, lake

consultants, and with the regulatory waterboards, we are coming up with a long term fix that will not harm our ecosystem. We are working with the SVL Country Club to treat the stream which will lower the nutrients coming into our lake from that flow. It will also help with algae control for the Country Club ponds as it works its way down to our lake. On that note, we have over 1900 acres of storm run off that flow directly into our lake, which is another major cause of high nutrient water and pollution in our lake. Any trash, leaves, grass clippings that are blown into the



street will go directly into our lake, adding to the cause of the condition of our lake. This will require all of us as a community to control what we allow to get into our lake through the storm drains, streets and gutters. We are also working with the Lahontan Waterboard on the required permits to treat our lake to control algae, nutrients and pollutants in our lake. We are looking to lower our lake for shoreline maintenance in February 2019. Our plan is to lower the lake at least 24” to allow us to do some concrete repairs. This will continue every other year until all liner damages

have been repaired. We will keep you posted with the exact dates and timelines for the lake lowering as we get closer to the dates.

I also wanted to let you know that we will be placing trout in our lake with the same planting schedule as last year for winter fishing. We will be planting rainbow trout from Jess Ranch Hatchery as follows:

- 1-1 ½ pounders**
- 2,000lbs **11/13/18**
- 2,000lbs **12/04/18**
- 1,000lbs **12/18/18**
- 1,000lbs **TBD** after the lake repairs have been complete.

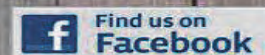
