

As we drive around we see that winter has not been kind to our lovely Palm trees. So many of them are now dead, and will have to be taken out soon. Just as a reminder, we will start our inspection of Palm trees June 1st. If you have dead ones, or Palm trees with lots dead fronds, please start taking care of them. Should you receive a Courtesy Notice and it is getting close to the due date, please call for an extension so you do not get a citation. Let's all keep our Palm trees looking healthy and clean.



Last month we posted a schedule for CSA 64 watering, and it was incorrect so we want to publish the correct one:

Addresses ending in Even Number:  
Monday and Thursday

Addresses ending in Odd Number:  
Tuesday and Friday

Watering Hour Restrictions:

- Residential – 9:00p.m. – 6:00a.m.  
(April 1 – Oct. 31) And 8:00a.m. –  
3:00p.m. (Nov. 1 – March. 31)

- Commercial – 9:00p.m. – 6:00a.m.  
(year round)

End User Watering Restrictions

- Potable water may not be used to wash sidewalks and driveways

- Runoff is not allowed when irrigating with potable water
  - A vehicle may only be washed if a hose is outfitted with an automatic shutoff nozzle
  - Potable water is only to be used in decorative water features that have a recirculation system
  - No irrigating outdoors during and within 48 hours following measureable rainfall
  - Restaurants can only serve water to their customers upon request
  - Potable water cannot be used to irrigate ornamental turf on public street medians
  - Irrigation with potable water outside of newly constructed homes and buildings not in accordance with emergency regulations or other requirements established by the Building Standards Commission and the Department of Housing and Community Development is prohibited
- We have been told by employees at CSA 64, that if you water by hand that you may water whenever you like. It would seem the restriction is with the sprinkler systems and other processes. We are also told that if you add lots of iron to your lawn it will stay green with the

twice a week watering.

Since we live in the desert we need to start using the plants that grow up here and use very little water. This way we get the best of both worlds. Here is a list of some of the plants that do well up here with little water:



*Evening Primrose* – Copper Canyon Daisy

*Black Dalea* – Woolly Butterfly bush

*Hummingbird Mint* – Rose Sage

*Blue Fescue* – Jerusalem Sage

*Pink Rockrose* – Hollyleaf Cherry

*California Fuchsia* – Desert Marigold

*Sugar Bush* – Cleveland Sage

*Warley Rose Rockrose* – Lavender Cotton

*Red Yucca* – Sierra Gold Dalea

*Rexas Ranger* – Paperflower

*Hot Lips Sage* – Red Hot Poker

Try planting some of these plants in your landscaping and save yourself a lot of water, and share in the beauty of the desert at the same time.

Were you one of the many owners who received a Weed Abatement letter from San Bernardino County? If not, then you're one of the few who did not. Those of you that are in our Weed Abatement program felt some concern when receiving the letters, but were reassured when your lots were cleared and found weed free. We know many of you spoke with County regarding these notices, and the Association did likewise. Needless to say.....the lots have been cleared!!!!



## OUR LAKE



### 4th Annual Alum Treatment

#### Lake Closure: May 16- May 20, 2016

The lake will be closed and will not permit any activity from May 16 - May 20, 2016 due to our annual alum treatment. This treatment is to improve water clarity. You will see dramatic improvement in clarity within days after our application.

The treatment is used to improve water quality. Nutrient loading, particularly phosphorus has accelerated eutrophication, which reduced the ecological health and recreational value to our lake. Eutrophication will produce pervasive algal blooms including toxic blue-green algae, noxious odors, low water transparency and depletion of dissolved oxygen that will kill fish.

Just to give you a brief description: Alum is applied in a liquid state at 45mg/l dosage. On contact with the water, the process of flocking occurs. The Floc created by the alum will grab phosphorus and sediment that is floating in our water. The phosphorus in it can no longer be used as food by algae organisms. Due to its density, it will settle to the

bottom leaving the lake noticeably clearer. It is the same process they use for drinking water treatment. We have tested the water column and soil at the bottom of our lake to monitor any residual build-up of Alum that might have occurred. Our testing which is done by an outside laboratory shows that Aluminum is extremely low to Non-detectable in our soil and water. This is most likely due to dilution that occurs as we continuously pump fresh well water plus the water we receive from the Country Club streams in the amount of 4.6 million gallons per day or 1.7 billion gallons per year. We also released 900 million gallons of water out to our neighbors Mojave Narrows park last year. Our lake only holds approx. 586 million gallons when full, so you can see that we are moving a lot of fresh water through our lake 24 hours a day, 365 days per year.

Please note the dates on your calendars, we will also be sending out reminders as we get closer to the date. During the process the water will turn an aqua blue color and immediately we will see over 20' of water clarity. Boat traffic and wind action will lower the quality as they turn up the water and sediment off the bottom, but we have experienced clearer waters as treatments continue.




### Boating Reminders:

- The maximum speed for all vessels is 35 miles per hour (5.4.1) unless the following conditions apply: Any time when landward of the orange buoys (no-wake zones); during hours of darkness; when passing within 100 feet of any vessel that is capsized, being towed or within 100 feet of any downed skier; or within 200 feet of the swim beach area.
- All vessels must carry at least one personal flotation device for each person onboard while underway. Children under the age of 12 MUST wear a personal flotation device at all times while aboard any vessel.
- Vessels may not be loaded beyond the manufactures specifications.
- Personal watercraft may not tow a skier or any other recreation devices at any time.
- No vessels may follow within 200 feet of a skier, nor shall they follow or jump in the wake of any vessel at any time.
- A red/orange flag will be raised anytime a skier is preparing to ski, a skier is down (being recovered), a tow-line is in the water, a vessel is being towed and/or anytime while trolling.

• Pursuant to SVLA Rules & Regulations 5.1.4, all vessel operators must obtain and maintain a SVLA Vessel Operators Permit (VOP). To obtain a permit, an operator must possess a valid driver's license, be at least 16 years of age and pass a written test covering SVLA boating regulations. This is done to ensure that people operat-

ing vessels on Spring Valley Lake are responsible for understanding our proprietary boating regulations and have achieved a higher level of awareness compared to operating requirements set by the state and other public waterways. We offer the vessel operators test daily at 9:00am. 





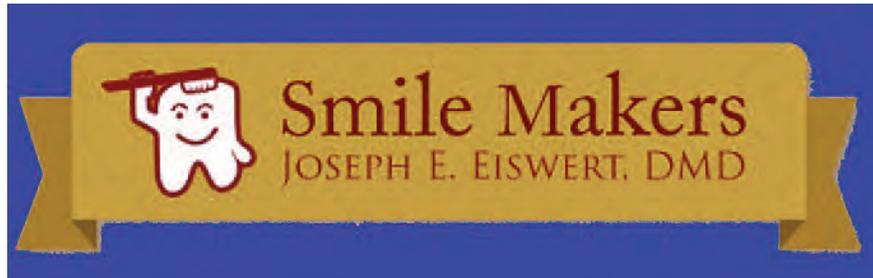
