

Lake Safety -by Corporal Ortiz
Hello to all the wonderful residents of Spring Valley Lake. My name is Joshua Ortiz and I am a Corporal with the Spring Valley Lake Association Public Safety Department. This year I have graciously been given the position to be head of our summer lake patrol team. As a proactive measure, I would like to take this time to address all our homeowners who own lake front property or a vessel, and educate them in equipping themselves with water safety tools. There are tons of variations of water safety equipment designed to keep everyone safe (both rescuer and victim) in the event of an emergency.



One of the most common devices is the **RING BUOY**. You have probably seen this device around community pools and water parks. Ring buoys may come with or without a rope attached, however, I recommend obtaining one with an attached rope so that you may be able to retrieve the victim if they are out of arms reach. Ring Buoys are deployed by throwing the ring within the victim's arm length, allowing the rope to flow freely. Once the ring

buoy is thrown towards the victim, shout for the victim to grab ahold of the ring buoy and to hold it closely to their chest as you will pull them in to safety.



A useful, but not as well known, device is the **THROW ROPE**. Throw ropes are light weight, compact, and are easily stored on any dock or vessel. To deploy this device, place the loop of the rope from the open end of the bag around your non-throwing hand. Then, with your throwing hand, grab the bag and make an under handed throw to the victim in the water. The goal is to aim past the victim's head, but allow the rope to stay within arm's length so the victim may grab ahold. Once the rope is thrown over the victim, shout for the victim to grab ahold of the rope and to hold it closely to their chest as you will pull them in to safety.



This device is commonly referred to as a **BOAT HOOK**. Boat hooks are often expandable which allows for them to be easily stored or mounted. They typically range

from six to twelve feet in length and are made to float in the water. Most boat hook variations have a rubber or foam handle on one end to allow a firm grip, and a plastic hook free of sharp edges on the other end. The boat hook can be used to grab onto a floatation device being used by the victim, or to allow the victim to directly grab ahold of as you or others pull them to safety. Another use for the boat hook is to aid in the locating of victims who may be submerged underwater at a depth to which clarity levels are low. I recommend drying of the boat hook after each use to prevent the water

from creating a suction making it difficult to expand the next time it needs to be used.

If, in the event that you witness or suspect a drowning in our community, please contact Spring Valley Lake Public Safety Department at (760) 245-6400 as we will be able to be respond quickly, AND call 911 as they will be able to provide more resources to aid in the event of an emergency. Keeping Our Lake Free of Mussels -By Lieutenant Hartley

Hello to all the Spring Valley Lake residents. This is a friendly reminder about the importance of keeping our lake free of any Quagga or Zebra mussels. When you are removing your vessel from Spring Valley Lake a Public Safety Officer will be placing a tag on your vessel and trailer. If this tag is still attached when returning your boat to our lake, then we know that your boat has not been in any other bodies of water. If you do take your vessel to another lake, then please follow the steps below to make sure your vessel is not transporting invasive mussels from that lake to ours. Whenever you leave freshwater, take the following actions:

- Remove the boat from the water and away from the launch ramp for vessel inspection and cleaning.
- Thoroughly inspect all exposed surfaces on your vessel and trailer. If you find any mussels, scrape them off and kill them by crushing them. Dispose of the remains in the trash. Alert the Department of

Fish and Game at 866-440-9530.

- Remove all plants and mud from your boat, trailer, and all equipment. Dispose of all material in the trash.
- Carefully feel your boat's hull for any rough or gritty spots, which may be young mussels that have settled on your vessel and cannot be seen. Microscopic Quagga/Zebra mussels will feel like sandpaper.
- Away from the waterway, wash your boat's hull, trailer, equipment, bilge, and any other exposed surfaces with high-pressure, hot water. When possible use water at a temperature of 140° F (60° C) at the hull – or about 155° (68° C) at the nozzle, which will kill the mussels. Dry the boat as much as possible.
- Drain all water from your boat (pull all plugs) and dry all areas, including the motor, motor cooling system, live wells, ballast tanks, bladders, bilges, and lower outboard units. Make sure that all

life jackets, water skis or other items that have been in the water, including anchors, ropes, etc., are inspected, cleaned, and dried.

- Thoroughly clean all fishing and recreational equipment (fishing nets, etc.).
- Clean and dry personal belongings, clothing, and footwear that have come in contact with the water.
- Keep your watercraft dry for at

least five days in warm, dry weather and up to 30 days in cool, moist weather before launching into a freshwater.

Day boats or those that “come and go” and spend only a few hours in the water are still at risk for picking up and transporting mussels that may be attached to aquatic weeds. The basic cleaning steps apply to any and all watercraft.



As we work on these amenities, we take pride in doing a great job and saving the community money by doing it's great to see so much activity as we get ready for the summer. The warmer days are bringing more of the people out to enjoy the amenities around our community: on the lake, at the beach, parks, fishing, basketball, baseball... it is so great to see everyone out there using these amenities. Our crews are actively increasing our attention on trash and maintenance issues. Maintenance works hand and hand with our Community Services department to make all

of the events go as smoothly as possible. As we just had our first Family overnight Campout with more than 30 tents and over 120 people, this was a great unique experience that required a lot of planning and preparation. We had some good food, fun events and crafts before campfire time. We look forward to planning the next family campout and hope to see even more families there to enjoy this beach camping experience.

We have a lot of events coming up that our team is preparing for and hope to see you enjoying. From our concert series, and summer kick off to the family festival and firework show, we hope to see you out there.

We have been diligent with our weed clearing on the 5 1/2 miles or 58 acres of bridle trails and v-ditches. We have been expending a lot of man hours in the past couple of months controlling the weeds on the EQ side.

Add that to the 10 acres of green belt we have on the lake side and you can imagine how we have been dreaming of weeds while we sleep.



While these things are all going on, we are still working hard on other areas around the community like planting annuals in pots at fishing area 8 and adding our first pet friendly drinking fountain at fishing area 10 on Lakeview near Seagull. We have already started building 2 additional pet friendly drinking fountains that will be placed at fishing areas around our lake. We will keep adding these until we have replaced all the current drinking fountains.



We have also been working with Heritage Victor Valley Medical Group as they will be donating some outdoor exercise equipment that SVLA will install at some of the fishing areas. We will keep you posted with more information as we work on what equipment is going where so that you can add some fun fitness training to your walk or run around our lake.

OUR LAKE



We are currently working on our annual painting of all buoys and re-positioning them to their proper location and quantity. This process usually takes us 2 months as we handle all 92 buoys before completion.

Our lake consultant is scheduled to take readings and samples of our lake mid May. This report will be posted on our website when it is complete. This sampling is in addition to our monthly sampling we do in-house. Look for this on our website under the Lake tab.

Memorial Day, which falls on May 29th, honors those Veterans that made the supreme sacrifice. The Spring Valley Lake Veterans Club honors our fallen with a moment of silence at each monthly meeting.
