Door-to-door Trick-or-Treating and "Trunk-or-Treating"

Many traditional Halloween activities involve mingling with neighbors, sharing treats, and visiting carnivals and pumpkin patches. The County requires compliance with State of California Health Orders, which are subject to change in response to the nature of the pandemic. The County also urges residents and businesses to exercise an abundance of caution while engaging in traditional Halloween activities, and encourages residents to opt for safer alternatives. Carelessness during other holidays has led to spikes in sickness and death, as well as increased restrictions.

These activities usually involve children and adults from various households gathering on porches, sidewalks or behind parked vehicles, accompanied by the sharing of candy and other treats. People who are immune-compromised, who have pre-existing conditions, or are age 65 and older should consider avoiding Halloween activities. Individuals who are feeling sick or believe they might have been exposed to COVID-19 should stay at home (isolate) and should not participate in these activities.

The County urges residents to use extreme caution by ensuring they and their children wear face

coverings, remain at least six feet away from other trick-or-treaters, frequently use hand sanitizer, accept only wrapped food items, and examine all treats for tampering. Consider limiting the number of homes you visit and/or staying in close proximity to your home.

Residents handing out candy and treats are urged to wear face coverings, provide only wrapped items, use tongs or wear gloves to pick up treats and candy when distributing, wash their hands frequently, and discourage trick-or-treaters from gathering closely on their property or near their vehicles. Consider opening the bag or container without touching the

candy and placing the candy on a table or tray to maintain social distancing so children can pick up their own candy. Ensure that trick or-treaters only touch the piece of candy they have selected. Individuals who are feeling sick or have possibly been exposed to COVID-19 should stay at home (isolate) and should not hand out candy.

Residents who do not believe they can take these precautions should turn off their lights to signal that they are not participating in trick or treating.

Residents are encouraged to use creative ways to safely hand out candy to trick-or-treaters.

We are here to help! I would like to say welcome to the many new owners in the community. For those of you who may not be aware, the code enforcement department is located in the association office. With the office reopening, we have taken measures to ensure the safety of homeowners and staff. Though you may come in to speak to the code department, we ask that owners still utilize our online services to submit complaints or update us on the status of your properties.

Annual Inspections:

I am proud to say all properties will have been thoroughly inspected as of October 16. It took approximately four months to complete all inspections. Every year we strive to be more efficient than the previous. A meeting will be held with the department on October 23 to discuss ways we can improve. We are open to comments or suggestions which can be submitted via email at code@svla.com. Next month we will feature several homes in the community that passed inspection with flying colors. Some may wonder why certain properties remain in disre-

pair. Unlike many owners who take pride in their properties, there are some who are unable to or simply refuse. This, at times, can be frustrating for Code Enforcement because, to the community, it appears that "nothing is being done". Let me assure you that each property has been inspected in the same manner. Please understand that if you were say issued a notice for house numbers missing or similar, we also issued a notice to any neighbor who has weeds and unsightly items. We look at each violation equally and allow owners time to make corrections. When corrections are not made, fines are posted to the owners account and doubled till the items are rectified. In the rare occasion when owners remain in violation, legal action is pursued. As we are not able to disclose homeowners' disciplinary actions, I can say there are several homes in the community that have been forwarded to our legal team.

As a reminder: With the closing of our summer season, Its time to put those trailers, boats, and toys in storage. **If parked over 72 hours in a driveway, a notice will be issued.**

Hello SVLA Residents, We can't believe it's already October!! Who knew that the year would still fly by, even during a pandemic? Thankfully, the pandemic has not slowed down our Maintenance Department, as they have still been busy getting projects completed throughout the Community... Look below to see what we were able to accomplish this month:

Beach Area:

- Sanitized all restroom door handles and hard surface areas at least 3 X's per day
- Dragged beach daily
- Blew concrete sidewalk of sand & dirt daily at the west beach by condos
- Trash removed daily on beach area
- Wiped down all picnic tables
- Emptying trash cans daily
- Replaced 1 control light timer
- Sanitized playground equipment every 2-3 hours daily
- Adjusted all light timers
- Continue painting and repairing picnic tables
- East beach PSD's courtesy dock wood was deteriorating. Maintenance removed it and will be building a new replacement.

- Removed leaves, debris and soil from east and west beach parking lot
- Pressure washed beach restrooms
- Installed Covid-19 signs at the swim beach area

Parks:

- Sanitized playground equipment every 2-3 hours daily
- Sanitized FA #8, Meadowlark Park RR's, AO exterior RR's and Beach RR's door handles and hard surface areas at least 3 X's per day.
- Emptying trash cans daily
- Weed abated Meadowlark Park
- Replaced all swings at Meadowlark Park

Equestrian Estates:

- Started remodeling EQ Club Room restrooms. Restrooms are 25% complete
- Continue covering squirrel holes at Playfair Park and Long acres Park 3 times per week
- Sanitized playground equipment every 2-3 hours daily
- Replaced damaged vinyl fencing at Long Acres Park

Fishing Areas:

- Fishing area #2 - setup cones by the seawall (NO FISHING), to protect floating island plants. These floating islands were move to FA #12.

- Emptying trash cans daily
- Fishing area #3- Closed entire fishing area to protect floating islands.
- Repaired and painted picnic tables
- Repaired damaged railings at FA #8
- Pressure washed Picnic Area #1 daily.
- Weed abated all fishing areas
- FA #8 restroom building was pressure washed
- Installed a dog waste station at FA #14

Buildings:

- Sanitized AO building, Community Building & exterior AO restrooms door handles and hard surface areas 3 times per day
- Community building was pressure washed
- Association building was pressure washed
- Maintenance building was pressure washed
- Installed all interior lighting in the Community Building

Grounds:

- Weed abated Parkway
- Repaired sprinklers in all common areas
- Trimmed all bushes at the west beach

Floating Islands:

- Floating Islands at FA #3 & FA #12 are doing well. Aquatic plants are flowering and establishing

Wells:

- All wells are active with no mechanical issues
- Installed new control boxes for Wells #1 & #7

Parkway Median:

- Checked and repaired as needed irrigation system
- Weed abated

Lake Filtration Systems:

- Flush FA #1, #7, #9 & #14 water filters every Friday

Lake & Marina Dock Maintenance:

- Repositioned buoys back to their original location
- Repaired courtesy dock wood flooring at the marina
- Skim lake for debris 2 times per week
- Installed 12 NO WAKE buoys by the entrance fingers

Play It Safe

Due to the ongoing spread of COVID-19 in our communities, please follow these simple steps to help keep our outdoor playgrounds safe, open and fun.

Halloween Night

Halloween is one of the busiest nights of the year for Spring Valley Lake. Here are some guidelines to keep in mind to help you have a safe and spooky night.

Trick-or-treating around the community is allowed from 6pm to 8pm. Due to COVID_19, the community center's Halloween event will not be taking place this year, and the building will be closed.

Your safety is our highest priority. Public Safety Officers, with assistance from California Highway Patrol, Fire Department, COP's and the Sheriff Department will be out to assist with any problems that might occur throughout the night.

According to San Bernardino County, "The County urges residents to use extreme caution by ensuring they and their children wear face mask coverings, remain at least six-feet apart from other trick or treaters, frequently

use hand sanitizer, accept only wrapped food items, and examine all treats for tampering. Consider limiting the number of homes you visit and/or stay in close proximity to your home."

Be careful while walking the streets in the community on this night. As an extra safety precaution, carrying a flashlight is highly recommended. Reflective tape on your child's costume is another way to help drivers see your family walking in the dark.

Unlike years before, construction work may take place on several roads. Be careful walking around these areas. If you plan on driving in or out of the community, I suggest allowing yourself extra time to do so.



My name is Joseph W. Brady. My wife Deborah K. Brady and I currently on Rain Shadow Road in Spring Valley Lake. My wife and I own an additional home next door to us on Rain Shadow Road. Deborah and I have been a resident of Spring Valley Lake since May 1988 when I originally rented my house and subsequently purchased in 1999.

I am also President of Joseph W. Brady, Inc., dba The Bradco Companies, the High Desert's longest standing full-service commercial, industrial, office, retail, and land brokerage firm.

My wife and I are involved in the High Desert Community as the owners of several business, publisher of The Bradco High Desert Report, past volunteers for the Spring Valley Lake Homeowners Association and participants in many civic affairs. In addition, I am humbled and proud to serve the community as an elected member of Board of Trustees at Victor Valley Community College.

In March 2008, while I served a three (3) year term as Chairman on the SVLA Homeowners Association Budget and Finance Committee, it became clear that there **might** be an opportunity to take a look at creating a Community Services District in reformatting what CSA 64 had been doing. From 2008 to 2009, we reached out to Ms. Kimberly Cox in Helendale, who at that time was a part of a movement to create their own CSD, and Mr. Charlie Johnson, who was very instrumental in the creation of the Phelan Pinon Hills CSD. We opted not to move forward at that time as the community received great service from CSA 64.

Nearly two years ago, I was informed that a group of volunteers from our community wanted to explore the possibility of a new CSD.

In May of 2019, I received a copy of the report prepared by Mr. Steve Garcia, Chairman and Mr. Rory Shannon (residents of Spring Valley Lake). Looking through that report and the documents that have been posted by LAFCO, I still see and support that there is absolutely no professional reason to replace CSA 64.

done a great job in providing services to Spring Valley Lake.

I've recently supplied the new SVL CSD formation group, eleven (11) different documents (as of July 15, 2020) that clearly show that **our water is the cheapest water within the region and that we experience no service problems**. I also secured from the county the written responses to nearly 38 questions that have been asked at public forums over the last year. These documents, with all factual answers, are available on our website at .

LAFCO (Local Agency Formation Commissions) which approved the concept of the Proposed SVL CSD is now allowing the residents of Spring Valley Lake to decide if they want a new CSD by allowing them to vote on the issue. Most of the SVL residents have not been made aware of the new CSD formation proposal, a fact about which I have been extremely concerned about since the proposal was launched in 2019.

I can tell you that since February 2020, I have had 70± people contact me personally (by phone, text, Facebook, or email) and were not only opposed, but would like to be heard. **Please join me and the growing number of supporters to Save CSA 64. The residents of SVLA need to know and become informed!**

As former co-founder of Spring Valley Lake Concerned Property Owners (SVLCPO), **I'm not only opposed to this plan but there is nothing in the plan that tells us that the residents, at the end of the day, will be any better than CSA 64. The proponents argue that we "need local control."**

I do not believe in local control by inexperienced Board of Directors. This would not be like running a business. There is a lot more to operating public service agency. **I believe that we owe the residents of SVL full and comprehensive disclosure of the increased costs and risks as well as any anticipated benefits.**

I am honored to live near Mr. Mark Reynolds. I have known Mark for many years even when he was the Director of Finance for the Apple Valley Fire Protection District. Mark sent me an email on April 15, 2020, at 8:29 PM and the subject was: "Supporting CSA 64." Listed below is what he said in that email:

"There is a small group of people in Spring Valley Lake who feel becoming an independent CSD would be economically beneficial on a local basis, however I am not one of them. Just because this group spent a couple of years researching if you can, does not mean you should, leave CSA64.

I have spent the better part of two decades working in a California Independent Special District, having retired in 2015 as the Director of Finance for the Apple Valley Fire Protection District. Knowing what I know now, becoming our own community services district would be a terrible hardship for our community in the long run, because along with grabbing more revenue comes a myriad of related expenditures that cannot be ignored.

As a part of the management team during my working years, I saw first-hand how much effort it takes to manage and operate a special district. There are so many decisions with long reaching ramifications, it is hard to begin a discussion. CSA64 is working fine and to have a new CSD Board of Directors would be duplicating current government management already in existence.

New Spring Valley Lake CSD Board decisions issuing policies regarding whether employees will be unionized, what type of salaries and retirement system will be offered, how and at what level will the retirements be funded, is but a tip of the iceberg on all the issues confronting Spring Valley Lake. Again, I DO NOT SUPPORT this change, and neither do several of my golfing neighbors, two of which are Arvy Lyon and Chester Norys, who have lived in Spring Valley Lake in excess of 30 years.

Please feel free to use my name in support of your efforts to champion staying with CSA64, because they are doing a bang up job and warrant our support."

In challenging the proponents of the proposed SVL CSD, to their submittal to LAFCO (Local Agency Formation Commission) listed below is a rate comparison clearly shows how low our water is from the 2019-2020 Phelan Pinon Hills Financial Budget Review. The proponents of the proposed SVL CSD do not want you to see this.

Helendale is not on the chart because this was based upon a 3/4" meter and Helendale does not have a comparable meter.

We do have a Treasurer that is working with us (who is a resident of SVL and donating their time free of charge). We also have a person who has political experience working with us free of charge. These are two people who care about SVL and are very concerned that special interests are looking for looking for big contrast and making a large amount of money, stipend, with medical and dental benefits will want to control our water, our sewer, our street sweeping, etc. Special interests seek money, not service to the community.

In closing, we have formed a committee to oppose the creation of this new proposed SVL CSD. The committee is called **Save CSA 64**. Our website can be visited at . We can also be reached at or on our message line at (760) 678-7897.



**Barstow Community College Launches Barstow
Community Connection**

Providing Access and Technology to the Barstow Area

Barstow, CA- Barstow Community College is launching an innovative program—the Barstow Community Connection—in collaboration with the City of Barstow, area businesses and churches to offer free Wi-Fi access to current and prospective students.

With approximately 70 % of Barstow residents relying on some form of government assistance, the COVID-19 pandemic has had an even greater impact on employment and the ability to access higher education in our city. Dr. Eva Bagg, Superintendent-President of Barstow Community College, challenged her employees to come up with an equitable solution that would provide maximum access to educational opportunities for Barstow area residents. Dr. Bagg also contacted Dr. Nikki Salas, Barstow City Manager, and local businesses to be part of the answer to the growing digital divide. The result is the Barstow Community Connection—a program that provides free wireless access to students and potential students in certain areas of Barstow.

The free Wi-Fi is possible by placing Wireless Access Points (WAPs) inside partner buildings using an existing internet source. This allows the internet to reach up to 600 feet without disrupting the partner's internet. Current students will benefit by having multiple areas in town to access the free internet services while city residents who want to attend college but thought it impossible, can now access the college for application, financial aid, support services and enrollment via a mobile phone or other technology.

The college has also launched a technology loan program for enrolled students.

The Barstow Community Connection free Wi-Fi access will launch on October 19th, in conjunction with the start of the Fall 2020 second 9-week session. Initial partners include; city parks (Dana Park), as well as local businesses (Gesirtech Realty, Treasure House Mall, Dee-Lux Realty, Billie's Kitchen, Rosita's, and Fitness MD), and area churches (Silver Valley Baptist Church, Calvary Chapel, and Union Missionary Baptist Church). To view a map of where the free Wi-Fi is available, please go to www.barstow.edu/bcccconnect.html.

The college has plans to expand this free Wi-Fi access to the surrounding areas, including Yermo and Baker, and are continuously adding new Barstow Community Connections Wi-Fi locations.



Our Spring Valley Lake

The drawings from 1969 are the very first plans presented to Boise Cascade Properties by architect, Clifford May. The Lakeside entrance still stands today. It is interesting that Mr. May references the street as “Big Bear cut-off road”. It seems that before the street was named “Spring Valley Parkway” Big Bear cutoff was used to describe the area of discussion. The same is repeated on the drawings for the planned entrance to the Equestrian Estates as well.

Entering the Lakeside of Spring Valley Lake would demand a structure that could be seen by travelers in the vast empty desert. The land the support structures are on, was property acquired by Boise Cascade from United States Land, Inc. in 1968 along with the other acreage for the project. As time went on, the properties on either side of the overhang were acquired by other entities.

The Equestrian Estates entrance was designed around the

world of horses. A movie and TV icon, Roy Rogers, was a famous figure in Apple Valley. He and his wife, Dale Evans, known as the singing cowboy and cowgirl, resided in Apple Valley for many years; and Mr. May was inspired to go with a theme of the “West”




(Above) Tamarisk & Bear Valley Road

for the entrance to the area where property owners can own horses. While the drawings were done in 1969, progress was slow for the Equestrian Estates, and by 1978 only four homes had been built on the full acre lots. Clifford May also designed the Equestrian area and barns, but sadly, those drawings could not be located for this article.

The other drawing, appears to be Tamarisk and Bear Valley Road. Mr. May names Tamarisk, “A Street”. It is interesting that he has shows a planned shopping center where the Lake View School is today. The drawing depicts an entrance structure to Spring Valley Lake.
