

We hope you have been keeping them in the shade with plenty of cool water. It doesn't seem like summer is going anywhere just yet, so do what you must to keep your landscaping alive, those pets cool, and yourself from having heat stroke.

When we see your trash cans left in the streets, we are going to write you a Courtesy Notice.



We have warned some over and over about this issue. Trash cans belong out of sight. The only ones that should be out are ones with **Red Tags**. This signals us that you are disabled and must leave your trash can in front of the ga-

rage or on the side of the garage. It doesn't take much to put the two containers away on Monday or Tuesday. Thanks for your help regarding this issue.



Not only has the weather been bad for humans and animals, but it has fried a lot of our landscaping. As we drive around our community, we see more and more dead lawns. What little grass there is quickly turning into just dirt. When this occurs, we must write a Courtesy Notice. Property owners will then be required to submit an Architectural Application to landscape the yard. For existing lawns, even if they are brown, you still need to keep the weeds under control. Keeping them down, mowing them, and grooming the yard and bushes is very important. 💎





We have installed safety railing at the upgraded fishing areas and I have attached some photos. The railings are designed and built in-house, using our own maintenance crew to build and install them. This is at a much lower cost to the Association than it would have been to purchase a custom built railing.

### At the Equestrian Estates

We have just added 10 new cameras in and around the barns to monitor the hay barns, all stalls, main barn, main arena and Equestrian center. We will also start looking into the cost involved in replacing the judges gazebo at the EE Center. It is up for replacement on the reserve study.

### OUR LAKE



We just finished up rebuilding 6 air pumps and replacing 2 others. Currently these 8 aeration pumps help the ecological balance of our lake by using oxygen to move water from the bottom of our lake up through the thermocline; increasing the areas for zooplankton, phytoplankton and fish to live in. Also, the increased levels of oxygen near the bottom increases the aerobic bacteria that

pumps are only on the north end of the lake. You can find more information on and about our lake on our website: [www.svla.com](http://www.svla.com).

One of the other items we increased maintenance on during summer is the buoy management. The buoys tend to move and/or break free from their anchors more often during the summer months when they are very much needed. We seem to be winding down the increased summer use of our amenities as the children head back to school; but I'm sure the weekend use will remain for sometime as the summer temps hang around. I just want to remind all boaters that crossing the orange buoy line is a no wake area even though the no wake buoy's may be set 30-40 feet inside the orange buoy line at the fingers. Those are set as a reminder. The perimeter orange buoy line is for non-powered vessels and is the no wake boundary. Please be safe out there and enjoy the amenities.

# Planning Committee

The Planning Committee Members would like to thank those who attended the Town Hall Meeting on August 6. This event was set up for discussion with SVL members on the concept of needs to the Meadowlark Park. We were pleased to see Steve Garcia, Board President, Amy Stanton, Board VP, Christopher Huntingford, Board Secretary and Planning Committee Board Liaison and Director Loran Keith among those present.

Dennis Teece, Director of Operations, presented his Power Point layout and spoke about the need for the planned upgrades to Meadowlark Park. Also present and representing SVL Little League, was Randy Guth who has been instrumental in his

knowledge of the placement of the three fields needed for the safety and pleasure of the baseball players. My first sentence was that we were not there to discuss costs, budgets, or cost projections for this upgrade. But, with this community, that subject came up anyway. After some contentious voices were calmed, we explained that our committee was asked by the BOD in 2015 (actually one year ago this month) to come up with a concept, put out a survey, and work with the county and other entities. 

# More Roadwork Planned for SVL!

## News from Robert Lovingood: More Road Work and Well Project!

Following two major road projects, a new phase of road paving is planned for Spring Valley Lake, San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors Vice Chairman Robert Lovingood announced.

The 1.9-mile project is set to run from mid-August through mid-October and includes paving of:

**Kalin Ranch Drive, from Spring Valley Parkway to Arrowhead Trail**

**Country Club Drive, from Spring Valley Parkway to Riverview Drive**

**Pah-Ute Road, (a portion of which is funded by Victorville) from Ridgecrest Road to the end of the cul-de-sac just east of Spring Valley Parkway**

"Projects like these underscore our commitment to improving roads for residents of unincorporated communities," Supervisor Lovingood said. "Improving roads boosts property values and makes for a better, more enjoyable community."

Because of higher average daily traffic and condition, this will be a conventional asphalt overlay. Road crews will mill the existing road surface down, put down a leveling course with chips, then lay new asphalt over that. The road work is expected to be complete by mid-October.


The strategy for prioritizing road projects balances funding availability with community needs. Selection of specific projects or project areas utilizes a pavement management system that tracks the pavement condition index of all County maintained roads and recommends specific roads for treatment. Factors include: Average daily traffic, the number of trucks using the road, the road's importance to overall traffic circulation and roads that will benefit the most County residents.

### Board OK's new well project

The San Bernardino County Board of Supervisors took an important step to build a new well to serve Spring Valley Lake, Supervisor Lovingood announced.

The Board approved a contract July 26 to outfit a new well with a pump motor and piping to put the new well into service. County Service Area 64 provides water service to Spring Valley Lake. The casing of one well has been compromised, allowing sand to be pumped into the water supply. The new well will increase production capability in the lower pressure zone and allow the compromised well to be taken out of service.

"The County is committed to making the necessary investments to improve water service in Spring Valley Lake," Lovingood said.



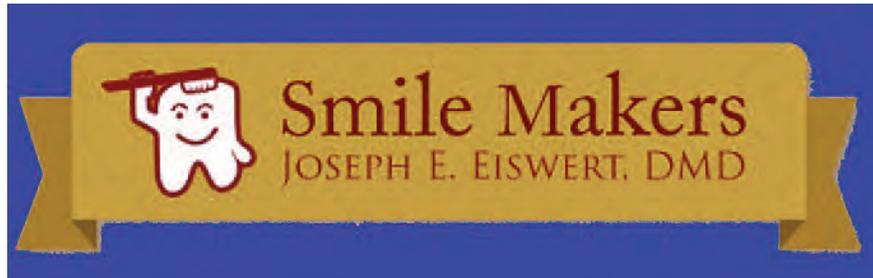
