





VOP Online Test

As the Director of the Public Safety Department, it is a priority of mine to ensure that residents of Spring Valley Lake experience quality service from our employees and are able to enjoy the amenities we offer. As most of you know, the Public Safety Department issues Vessel Operator Permits (VOP) that allows boat operators to gain access onto our lake. These can be obtained from the Community Center any day of the week at 9AM after the VOP test has been completed and passed. After speaking to residents, it is clear that there is a need for a more convenient alternative to the VOP Test. The Public Safety Department has created an online version of the test. This test will be available for the residents and their guests to take any day of the week at whatever time is convenient for them. The online test will be easy to take and will release the results of the exam immediately. Although you will still need to come into the Community Center to receive the physical copy of your VOP, this will hopefully benefit some of our members who are unable

to come in during our scheduled in-person test. If you do decide to take the online test and you pass the exam, you may come into the Community Center to obtain your VOP at either 9AM or 7PM any day of the week. As usual, you will need to bring your Spring Valley Lake member card and your current driver's license. Additionally, guests will need to be accompanied by a Spring Valley Lake member. The online VOP test will be accessible at www.SVLA.com under the Public Safety Department. We hope that members will utilize the online test to their convenience.

SVLA Rules and Regulations

5.1.7. Power vessel operators must be at least 16 years of age and must have a valid driver's license. Power vessels operator's permits shall expire on the same date as the operator's state driver's license; however, permits shall be automatically renewed without re-examination upon production of a current driver's license as long as the permit has not been expired for over one year.

Please remember the bottom on the lake is clay, therefore only mushroom type anchors or sandbags are the only anchors to be used while boating on Spring Valley Lake. Claw like anchors or anchors with sharp edges can cause damage to

the clay while the anchor is being dragged along the bottom. Please contact the Public Safety Department with any questions.

Rules and Regulations: 5.1.19. Only mushroom-type anchors and/or sandbags may be used.

PROJECTS AROUND THE COMMUNITY

Hope you are having a marvelous May. Our team has been working hard on the projects, weeds, and playgrounds.

Equestrian Estates

We are still working on clearing weeds from the v-ditches and trails as well as repairing irrigation, fences and bridges to list just a few things.

Meadowlark Park Project

We are on schedule with phase 2 as all the grading and irrigation is complete. The walking trails are complete. Hydroseeding is complete. The second backstop, dugout, bleachers and shade structure are being installed this month. We will be opening phase 2 up for use this month.

Marina Picnic Area

We are just about complete with removing all of the required soil to put the picnic table pads. This area will look similar to fishing area 10 with artificial grass, decomposed granite, plants palms, trees, shade structures, railing, plaques and flag poles. I added this picture of fishing area 10 for



reference; although the Marina Picnic area will have 4 picnic tables and shade structures.

OUR LAKE



We have been working with the Lake committee to conduct different types of filter testing to approach our lake issues from another direction; which may be an alternative to chemical treatment. We conducted our first test on Friday, April 19, filling a tub with 150 gallons of lake water and running the water through a pond bio filter with a 13 watt UV light. We cycled the water through the filter for 72 hours at 10 gallons per minute. The test was successful, clearing the water and killing the diatom algae. I had taken a picture of the water before the test and after the test. (See results on this page). The next test was to confirm that we can increase the speed of the time required by increasing the UV wattage. The second test was conducted on Thursday May 2 and successfully removed the diatom algae and cleared the water within 20 hours using the same filter, but increasing

the UV wattage to 78 watts and still pumping the water at 10 gallons per minute.

We are now working on a system that could be placed at a fishing area and multiplying this across all of our 14 fishing, 1 Marina Picnic and 2 Beach areas to start filtering the lake. These results also showed we lowered phosphorus by 93% and Nitrogen by more than 90%. Phosphorus is the food for algae and is what we control using chemicals such as alum. Not only did this test remove the Diatom algae bloom that is dominating, it removed other algae and it removed 93% of its food. It also cleared the water by 95% which is measured on this chart as turbidity. Please look for more info at our Board meeting this month.

Code enforcement wants to personally thank the wonderful home owners who are diligently taking the time and energy to maintain their landscape. If you have not heard it yet, we appreciate your dedication to contributing to the beatification of the community. Your hard work does not go unnoticed.

Recently, many homeowners have been issued an array of different colored trash cans. This is great, and we know many owners want to show their neighbors the cool new trash cans. Section 10.3 Trash Receptacles (Large items including but not limited to trash receptacles, tools, equipment, etc., shall be screened or removed from public view....) This applies to all trash receptacles whether it be green, gray, blue or pink. Be sure to place your trash cans out one day prior to pick up and remove from public view the day following scheduled pick up. If you are unsure of what day your area is scheduled for pick up, you can contact your local trash service Advance Disposal (Lakeside) or Town of Apple Valley (EQ Estates) for more information.

We have seen San Bernardino County code enforcement out and about inspecting the community. Not only do they inspect vacant lots, but also the landscaping of all homes. Should they see weeds over four inches, you will receive a notice from them. In correlation with the County, SVL code enforcement has temporarily ceased with issuing door hangers regarding weeds and are mailing the courtesy notices directly to homeowners.

Spring Valley Lake is a lake community. Residents may park their own boats in their driveways between May 1st and September 30th provided their boats have current SVLA vessel registration stickers. Evidence of long term storage such as expired registration, flat trailer tires and other signs that a vessel is inoperable will be in violation.

Do you have any questions or concerns for the Code Enforcement team? Don't hesitate to give us a call (760)245-9756. Each of our Code officers are assigned to different areas within Spring Valley Lake. Area assignments are as follows:
