As we welcome a new year, I want to extend my appreciation to all residents for your continued commitment to maintaining the beauty, safety, and integrity of our community. Our association thrives when we work together to make our community better. As we move into the new year, I'd like to share a few key updates and reminders from the Code Enforcement, Architectural Review, and Administrative departments.

In 2026, our focus remains on education first and enforcement second. Our goal is not to penalize, but to uphold the standards that protect property values and ensure a pleasant living environment for everyone. This year, we will continue doing patrols to address concerns early, conduct in depth annual inspection of homes in the community, and strive to maintain clear communication when violations occur. We appreciate the cooperation shown by many residents who quickly resolve issues upon notification—your efforts truly make a difference and are appreciated.

Our Architectural Committee processed a cornucopia of improvement requests this past year, from landscaping updates to home exterior renovations. Thank you for submitting your applications early and providing complete documentation. This greatly speeds up the review process. As a reminder, all exterior modifications require prior ARC approval, even if similar projects already exist in

the neighborhood.

We encourage homeowners planning spring projects to begin preparing now, and bring in their applications a month before they are ready to do the work. Early submissions help ensure timely decisions and avoid delays.

Our administrative team remains committed to responsiveness, transparency, and resident support. For 2026, we are excited to continue keeping the community aware of what is going on in the community whether it is through our Facebook page, Instagram, TikTok, E-Blasts, or the Breeze.

Our staff will be reaching out in the coming months to verify that the contact information on your account is correct, but if you want to be proactive feel free to call us first, as it will take some time to try reaching all homeowners.

GET MOVING WITH AN ELECTRIC BICYCLE



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Riding an e-bike instead of using a car can reduce your carbon impact.

E-Bikes allow people of all ages and physical abilities to experience the joy of cycling & exercise.

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⚡ E-Bike CLASSIFICATIONS

CLASS 1

PEDAL ASSIST

<20 MPH

A class 1 electric bicycle, or "low-speed pedal-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.



CLASS 2

THROTTLE ASSIST

<20 MPH

A class 2 electric bicycle, or "low-speed throttle-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that may be used exclusively to propel the bicycle, and that is not capable of providing assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 20 miles per hour.



CLASS 3

PEDAL ASSIST

<28 MPH

A class 3 electric bicycle, or "speed pedal-assisted electric bicycle," is a bicycle equipped with a motor that provides assistance only when the rider is pedaling, and that ceases to provide assistance when the bicycle reaches the speed of 28 miles per hour, and equipped with a speedometer.



Additionally, to operate a Class 3 E-Bike you must:

- Be 16 years of age or older
- Wear a helmet, regardless of age

No driver's license is required. Per California Vehicle Code Section 21212, **riders under the age of 18 must wear a helmet, regardless of bicycle type.**

Any purchased or modified E-Bike that can travel at speeds above 28 miles per hour is no longer considered an E-Bike, and is considered an "out of class electric vehicle" which is illegal to operate on public roadways.

Our club offers members a chance to step out of daily routines, meet other women, and give our children opportunities to socialize with neighborhood kids—especially for families whose children may not yet be involved in other social outings such as school or sports.

Popular Question: Is This Club Just for “Mamas”?

While our club name specifies “mama”, our club's answer to this question is not **so simple**. If anyone is beginning to plan to conceive soon, this is a great place for you to come and get all

the most realistic, raw and honest answers or tips that Google tends to water down in reference to motherhood. If you are a mother of older children or even adults, you are the VIP that we would love to have attend our meetings so that you can give moms at earlier stages tips as well.

One statement I've heard from neighbors is “I really admire the idea of SVL having a mama club, but I don't have kids”. Well, guess what - no one is going to judge you or make you leave! Ask yourself, have you learned anything in your life from someone who was not a school teacher? Probably so.

The analogy is that you don't have to have your own children to be a motherly figure and offer friendship and support or to receive the same in return. 
