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SUMMARY OF UPDATES

Lake Coving Issue



- The Board of Directors (BOD) and the General Manager have conducted a review of the lake coving issue. It has been decided that the lake will be lowered in 2026 to evaluate the extent of damage and obtain project bids. Project work is scheduled to commence in 2027 unless it is determined that immediate action is required. Determination of costs and funding strategies remains pending. (See article *Lake Coving Repairs* submitted by Vicki Fitch) Your patience is greatly appreciated as this project aims to be executed to the highest standard, ensuring durability for an estimated 50 years.

Audit Progress

- The ongoing audit has proven to be more comprehensive and time-consuming than originally anticipated. The auditors have requested a substantial amount of information, some of which

is readily accessible, while other data requires significant effort to compile. The staff, in collaboration with the accounting firm, is diligently working to provide the required information and complete the audit in a thorough and accurate manner.

Deep Dive Email Initiative

- A new email initiative, titled "Deep Dive", has been developed in partnership with the Communications Committee and staff. This initiative aims to disseminate updates on community events and activities to members. Members who have not yet signed up for email updates are encouraged to contact the Association and provide their information to stay informed.

Citation Committee

- A sub-committee is being established, comprising three members from the Citation Committee and three members from the Board of Directors. The primary focus of this sub-committee is to review the processes, rules, and enforcement measures related to citations. The objective is to foster a clearer understanding and improve interactions with property owners, thereby promoting compliance and enhancing the overall aesthetics of the community.

Lake Coving Repairs

Hello SVLA Neighbors!

We know that many of you have been curious, and a bit confused about what is happening regarding the Lake Coving Repairs and when that work is going to be done, so you can be prepared and to make decisions regarding your property. Although more information will come out as the time gets closer, we want to share the timeline with you and ask you to help us get the word out so everyone is in the know.

The following is the letter I read during our April Open Session, bringing everyone up to date, and promised to include it here in the Breeze as well as our weekly Deep Dive Newsletter.

The Board made a decision earlier this year, which was not acted upon or implemented, regarding the lake coving repairs and we apologize for the confusion this has caused. Last night we unanimously reaffirmed that decision and wanted to share it with all of you.

We know the Lake Committee has put an incredible amount of time and energy into the work towards getting the repairs done, and we believe they have come up with a solution that should meet our needs.

However, we also have experienced projects in the past that have not gone as planned and we believe a multi-year approach is the best course of action, as it will:

1. Give the homeowners ample time to plan accordingly with regard to vacations, events, registration of watercraft, etc.

2. It will give us, as a board, the time to come up with the financing or reductions in the budget to pay for the repairs.

3. It will provide us an added layer of confidence that we did all we could to make the best and most informed decision when it comes to corrective measures to the properties.

The General Manager has been tasked with creating an RFP (Request for Proposal) by our next Executive Board Meeting (May 19th), that we will be putting into adjudicated newspapers, magazines and online formats, in order to solicit proposals from as many companies as possible.

LAKE LOWERING

We will be lowering the lake first, in approximately September of 2026, for Inspections, Bidding and Emergency Repairs.

We will be lowering the lake **the second time, in approximately September of 2027, for repairs** that, depending on financing, could be Phase 1, if for some reason we are unable to complete all the repairs at that time.

We will keep the community informed of the stages as the project gets closer and a more specific schedule is available.

We appreciate your patience and welcome your questions and your input. Remember, it's time to submit Committee Applications again. So if you are passionate about the lake, maybe you want to join them!

MEMBERSHIP ID'S & GUEST PASSES REQUIRED ON SVLA PROPERTY



Congratulations to the three newly elected members of the Board of Directors. I look forward to working with each of you over the next two years as we continue to serve and support the Spring Valley Lake community.

Now that the election has concluded, I hope we can come together as neighbors and focus on progress. Over the past 18 years, I've had the opportunity to see many changes in our community—both positive and challenging. Unfortunately, I am currently witnessing some of the highest levels of community division I've seen during my time here. That said, I believe we can move forward constructively and respectfully.

Each year, with new Board members, the topic of code enforcement resurfaces. Based on my experience, I believe there are a few key steps we must take to make a lasting impact.

First, we need to engage in open dialogue with the community. This includes revisiting the SVLA mission statement and asking ourselves: Do the current conditions of our homes and properties reflect the values and standards we've set for Spring Valley Lake Association?

Our staff work hard to uphold those standards and enforce our

governing documents fairly. Unfortunately, they are often met with disrespect and verbal abuse simply for doing their jobs. Some residents have called the team “petty” after receiving notices, but when we review the files, the violations clearly support enforcement action.

We understand that some properties may have eight weeds while others have fifty. At the end of the day, both are in violation. Our goal is consistent enforcement—not subjective comparison. We do not want our staff to feel pressured to “pick and choose” which homes to cite based on how bad they look in comparison. That would be selective enforcement.

I also want to remind everyone that a courtesy notice is exactly that—a courtesy. It's an opportunity to correct an issue before further action is taken.

If there are rules that members of the community believe are outdated, overly strict, or unreasonable, I encourage you to formally bring those concerns to the Board for review. Change is possible through the proper channels.

However, when residents repeatedly ignore citations and violation notices, the Association is left with no choice but to escalate the matter to legal counsel. This results in sending a demand and, if necessary, lawsuits. To that end, I believe we must review our legal budget and consider increasing funding

for compliance enforcement. Additionally, we should assess our current staffing levels and evaluate the potential need for two additional enforcement officers.

Ultimately, meaningful change

requires a united community effort. I ask for your support as we work together to ensure that Spring Valley Lake remains the most well-maintained and desirable community in the High Desert.

Spring Valley Lake Update: Preparing for a Clean and Healthy Summer

As the warmer months approach, we're pleased to share updates on our ongoing efforts to maintain a clean, safe, and enjoyable environment at Spring Valley Lake.

Current Lake Operations

All wells and aerators are functioning properly, promoting healthy water circulation, and supporting oxygen levels essential for aquatic life. These systems help maintain natural water quality and a balanced lake ecosystem.

Additionally, all safety buoys have been thoroughly inspected and are correctly positioned throughout the lake, ensuring safe and clear navigation for all recreational users.

Maintenance Activities Ahead

In preparation for the summer season, our team will begin routine debris removal around the lake. Starting June 1st, we will conduct surface skimming three times weekly to collect floating debris and maintain clear, safe water conditions.

Water Quality Monitoring

Over the past two months, data monitoring was paused to allow

for necessary equipment upgrades. We have since replaced the LDO probe center cap and installed a new pH probe, restoring full monitoring functionality.

In addition, we are now implementing ORP (Oxidation-Reduction Potential) testing, which provides deeper insights into the lake's chemical balance and overall health. Beginning next month, we will have complete data available to better track trends and make informed decisions about lake management.

Invasive Species Monitoring

As part of our ecological protection efforts, we conduct routine inspections for quagga and zebra mussels—invasive species that can cause serious damage to lake infrastructure and ecosystems. We use artificial substrates strategically placed in the lake to detect early-stage mussel presence and ensure rapid response if detected. No signs of infestation have been observed to date.

Ongoing Lake Management Practices

Our standard management activities include:

- Algae monitoring, to observe natural growth and ensure it re-

mains within safe levels.

- Sediment assessments, to maintain appropriate depth and visibility.
- Aquatic vegetation observa-

tion. Currently, no visibility of aquatic plants.

- Wildlife activity tracking, as various species can affect lake ecology and water quality.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

Clint Summers, Director of Code Enforcement / Architectural

As spring comes into its own, our community begins to bloom—and unfortunately, so do weeds. The Code Enforcement team would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone about the importance of maintaining yards and lots in accordance with our community standards. We have had a marked increase in weed violations in the last couple weeks and hope you will help us keep the community looking great.

Why Weeds Matter

While a few stray weeds may seem harmless, excessive growth can lead to several issues, including:

- **Attracting Pests:** Overgrown vegetation provides hiding spots for rodents, snakes, and insects.
- **Fire Hazards:** Dry weeds become a serious risk as temperatures rise.
- **Curb Appeal:** Weeds can quickly detract from the overall appearance and property values of the neighborhood.
- **Allergies:** Some residents suffer from allergies that are worsened by pollen from common

weed species.

Failure to comply can result in **notices of violation** and, if not addressed in a timely manner, may lead to fines which are billed to the property owner's account.

Tips for Staying Weed-Free

- Use mulch if approved by the architectural committee for a change, or landscaping fabric to prevent weeds in flower beds.
- Apply pre-emergent herbicides in early spring to reduce growth.
- Mow regularly and edge along walkways and fences, or have a gardener maintain your property.
- If you're out of town, consider arranging for a neighbor or landscaping service to help.

Let's Work Together

We understand that maintaining a property can be a lot of work, and we appreciate your efforts to keep our neighborhood looking its best. Let's all do our part to keep our community clean, safe, and beautiful. Together, we can make a big difference—one yard at a time!

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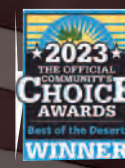

Lake Safety for Boaters and Lakeside Residents:
A Guide to Responsible Recreation and Living

Living near or spending time on a lake offers beautiful views, recreational fun, and peaceful moments on the water. However, with these privileges comes a shared responsibility for safety. Whether you're a boat operator or a lakeside homeowner in Spring Valley Lake, understanding and practicing lake safety is crucial to protect lives, property, and the environment.

BOATING SAFETY TIPS

1. Wear Life Jackets

- Every person on a boat should have a personal flotation device (PFD) of proper size readily accessible while underway. Children under the age of 13 must wear a PFD at all times while on board a vessel. Non-swimmers are especially at risk and should wear a PFD at all times while on board a vessel.

2. Vessel Registration and Inspections

- All motorized and non-motorized vessels must be registered with the Spring Valley Lake Association (SVLA).
- Motorized vessels require a vessel inspection by the SVLA Public Safety Department before being permitted on the lake.
- Everyone operating a vessel must have a Vessel Operators

Permit. You can contact the Public Safety Department to find out how to obtain one.

3. Know the Rules of the Water

- Familiarize yourself with SVLA rules and regulations, section 5, which covers speed limits, counter-clockwise direction of travel, right-of-way rules, and designated no-wake zones. Reckless or negligent operation can lead to accidents or citations.

4. Avoid Alcohol While Boating

- Just like driving a vehicle, operating a boat under the influence of alcohol is dangerous and illegal. Impaired judgment and slower reaction times increase the risk of collisions and drowning.

5. Check Weather and Lake Conditions

- Sudden storms or strong winds can create hazardous conditions. Check forecasts before launching and head back to shore if the weather begins to turn. The Public Safety Department will sound the lake evacuation siren when lightning is within five miles of the lake. If you are on the lake and hear the siren, please get off the water as soon as possible.

6. Use Proper Lighting and

Equipment

- All boats must be equipped with navigation lights for nighttime use. Ensure you also have a whistle or horn, throwable, fire extinguisher, and an anchor on board. Recommended additional equipment paddle or oar, bailing device (pump, bucket) tow line.

SAFETY FOR LAKESIDE RESIDENTS

1. Secure Your Docks and Boats

- Inspect docks regularly for loose boards, nails, or unstable supports. Due to the high winds in Spring Valley Lake, make sure boats are moored properly to prevent them from breaking loose and drifting away from the dock. Make sure lifts or hoists are functioning safely.

2. Install and Maintain Proper Lighting

- Use lighting at the ends of docks to ensure visibility at night.

3. Supervise Children and Guests

- Keep a close eye on children near the water, especially those who are not strong swimmers.

4. Emergency Preparedness

- Keep a first aid kit, rescue ring, and throw rope easily accessible.
- Know your local emergency contacts, such as the Spring Valley Lake Public Safety Department and the Sheriff Dispatch (760-956-5001).
- Have a clear address and property markers visible from the water for emergency responders.

5. Report Unsafe Behavior

- If you see reckless boating, speeding in no-wake zones, or swimmers out past the 16 feet easement area, report it to the Public Safety Department as soon as possible.
