

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
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SVLA BOARD PRESIDENT
JAY COHEN

Fellow Spring Valley Lake Association community members,

Greetings, and happy Summer!

I am both honored and humbled to have been elected as your Board of Directors President at the May organization meeting. I hope to, in this month's Breeze article, both introduce myself and give you a little background on who I am and share with you some of the items that your HOA board has already accomplished in the short time we've all been seated.

First and foremost, I'd like to thank all the candidates who ran for seats on the board, as well as those who were elected, or re-elected to the Board. All these community members have pledged to volunteer their time to help keep SVLA the "Jewel of the High Desert." Thank you all very much for your willingness to serve!

My bride Cherina and I moved to the high desert in April of 2024, as I was offered a position at Victor Valley College. Back where we're from though (New Hampshire and Maine), we have a long history of volunteerism and serving on non-profit boards.

For the past 10+ years, I've served as the Vice President of Technol-

ogy and Transformation for one of those 501c3 boards, and as the board secretary for the other. Since moving to the high desert, my family has been looking for ways to get involved in the community, as telecommuting for a board role is difficult when they meet early on east coast time.

I'm hoping that my extensive experience and drive will enable the board of directors to lead the association, and bring positive movement and change where necessary, while partnering with the association staff.

As for accomplishments to date, your board has been busy. At the last open session, we:

- Agreed to ensure that all emails and board of director contacts are responded to within 48-72 hours. If you have a question for us, please email us at board@svla.com, and we'll get back to you as soon as we can. Or, better yet, come to a board meeting and talk to us during the property owners open forum. You have 3 minutes to speak your mind.
- Enabled the association staff to once again sell gasoline at the marina, with an updated credit card machine.

- Proposed a simplification of the greenery rules to make it more ob-

jective vs. subjective.

- Agreed to abide by a Board of Directors code of conduct which holds us accountable to each other, and to the community at large, for putting your trust and faith in us to manage the association on your behalf.

- Formed a taskforce to address a 5-year plan for the association.

- Formed a taskforce to work with code enforcement to help clarify the rules, work on better ways to enforce those rules, address issues/concerns, and help enable our code enforcement team to best serve the community.

- Among other things... (There were 46 items on the open session agenda alone. I encourage you to review the video and/or minutes.)

As a board, we remain committed to moving forward, and acting on items, and only to table things when we absolutely must do so.

There are quite a few items that remain on our to-do lists, including, but not limited to, discussing Meadowlark Park, fixing the Lake coving (please see the article by Director Fitch in last month's Breeze), addressing issues with the bridges on the Equestrian estates, and enabling our association to serve this community to the best of their ability.

In an ideal world, we would be able to update the bylaws and rules and regulations this year too, though that requires many voting association members to accomplish. We've historically had difficulties reaching quorum for Board of Directors elections, and we need

66% of the vote, not 15%, to be able to modify our bylaws. Let's start now with getting the word out; I'd like to enlist each of you to start talking to your neighbors, and help the community build a large, and involved, membership to enable these needed changes. Together we can accomplish many great things, but we do need involvement to be successful.

On a side note, there have been many expressed concerns over property upkeep, weeds, and the general overall look of the association. Our code enforcement team remains diligent in doing everything they can to address these concerns. There's been a large uptick in notices that have been sent out, and we hope that those neighbors who have received a notice will address the issue or reach out for help.

Lastly, I'd also like to ask you to ensure your contact information is up to date at the association offices. Give them a call if you've moved, have changed your information/email address, etc. Help them keep you informed of what's happening. You can reach them at info@svla.com or 760-245-9756.

In closing, I want to again thank all of you, the board of directors, and all the association volunteers, staff, and members for putting your trust and faith in this board, and we remain committed to the duties, roles and responsibilities that you've entrusted us with.





CODE ENFORCEMENT

Clint Summers, Director of Code Enforcement / Architectural

As we are transitioning into the summer season, I'd like to take a moment to thank you for your continued efforts in keeping our neighborhood safe, attractive, and in compliance with community standards. June brings warmer days, longer evenings, and the perfect opportunity to get ahead of a few key maintenance items.

Here are a few important things to keep an eye on this month:

🌿 **Landscape Maintenance**

With the growing season in full swing, please ensure lawns are regularly mowed, edged, and kept free of weeds. Overgrown grass, dead shrubs, and unkempt flower beds, and weeds can quickly diminish the appearance of our shared environment. Be sure to also trim back any trees or bushes that could be causing an issue for your neighbor.

🗑️ **Trash & Bulk Item Disposal**

Please remember that trash and recycling bins should only be placed at the curb no more than 24 hours before pickup and must be removed 24 hours after. Ensure that your trash cans are out of view and behind screening to avoid unwanted violations. If you need a dumpster on your property to clear up a project at your home, the Association can counter approve a dumpster to be on your property on an improved surface for up to 60 days. Longer than that, the Architectural committee will look at your application.

🏠 **Exterior Home Care**

Now is a great time to inspect your home's exterior for peeling paint, stained stucco, or other visible signs of wear. Power washing driveways, repainting trim, and repairing fences not only improve curb appeal, but also help maintain property values for everyone.

Architectural Modifications

Thinking of updating your landscaping, painting your home, or installing solar panels? Any exterior changes must go through the association's architectural review process. Submitting your request early helps prevent delays and ensures your project is in line with community guidelines. Please try to plan ahead as the deadline for the Architectural committee is 10 days before the second or fourth Thursday of the month.

Your cooperation with these standards is appreciated and helps maintain the quality of life we all value. If you have any questions or concerns, feel free to contact our office or visit the association website for more information. The Code Enforcement and Architectural department can be advised at code@svla.com or Architecture@svla.com at any time should you need to give an update.

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

Lake Hours for the Season

As we officially kick off the summer season, I'd like to remind everyone that **lake hours will be extended to midnight starting Saturday, May 24th, 2025**, and will remain in effect through **Labor Day, Monday, September 1st, 2025**.

Please keep the following important guidelines in mind:

- **No Wake After Sunset:** Once the sun sets, the entire lake becomes a "no wake" zone, regardless of the time. Operate your vessel at idle speed only.
- **Navigation Lights Required:** All vessels must display proper navigation lights after sunset. Lights must be fully operational and compliant with "Rules of the Road" regulations to ensure visibility and safety on the water.

Relevant Regulations:

- **5.4.2.2:** From sunset to 10:00 p.m. daily, except during the summer season beginning at sunrise on the Saturday of Memorial Day weekend through midnight on Labor Day, when lake access is extended until midnight.
- **5.5.1.4:** Navigation lights must be kept in serviceable condition and displayed between sunset and sunrise, and during any conditions of restricted visibility.

Let's work together to keep our lake safe and enjoyable for everyone. Wishing you a fun and safe summer season!

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

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The Essential Guide to Dog Walker Etiquette

Whether you're a professional dog walker or simply taking your own furry friend for a stroll, practicing good dog walker etiquette is crucial. It ensures not only your dog's safety and happiness but also fosters harmony with neighbors, other pets, and the environment. Here are some key guidelines every responsible dog walker should follow:

1. Pick Up After Your Dog — Always

This is the cardinal rule of dog walking. No one wants to step in dog waste or have their lawn treated like a toilet. Always carry enough waste bags and dispose of them properly. Leaving bags on trails or sidewalks is just as bad as not picking it up at all. SVLA has doggie bag stations located all throughout the community — typically found around major walkways and the parks. Notice the SVLA doggie bags are empty? Contact our Maintenance Department so they can quickly refill the stations. Use the email maintenanceadmin@svla.com or call 760-245-9756.

2. Use a Leash (and Use It Properly)

Even if your dog is well-trained, not everyone feels comfortable around unleashed dogs. Many areas legally require dogs to be on

leashes, and with good reason: it prevents unexpected confrontations, chases, or accidents. Use a sturdy, appropriately sized leash and avoid retractable ones in busy or high-traffic areas. Per SVLA Rules and Regulations, Section 3.3: All dogs or other domesticated animals are required to be kept on a leash no longer than 6' at all times.

3. Respect Other Dogs' Space

Not all dogs are social butterflies. Always ask before allowing your dog to greet another. Keep a close eye on body language, and if either dog seems uncomfortable, calmly walk away. Don't assume a wagging tail means an invitation to play.

The SVLA Dog Park is a great way to have your furry friend meet other dogs around the Community. The Dog Park is located at the Community Center at 12975 Rolling Ridge Dr. While using the Dog Park, kindly ensure that all gates are closed when you enter and exit.

4. Be Mindful and Stay Aware of your Environment

Keep your dog off private lawns and flower beds unless explicitly invited. When walking on sidewalks, be aware of your surround-

ings. Don't let your dog block the path or jump on passersby, especially children, seniors, or people who may be afraid of dogs.

Put the phone away and stay present. Watch for potential hazards—cars, bikes, other dogs, or dropped food. Listening to music? Keep the volume low enough that you can hear what's happening around you.

5. Keep Control During Group Walks

Walking multiple dogs requires skill and attentiveness. Make sure you can physically control them all, especially if you encounter other people or animals. Avoid crowded areas if you're handling more dogs than you can confidently manage.

6. Obey Local Laws and Park Rules

Always follow leash laws, park regulations, and posted signs. Some trails or beaches may be off-limits to dogs, or they may have leash-free hours. Know and follow the rules wherever you walk.

7. Keep Walks Enjoyable

A dog walk isn't just exercise; it's enrichment. Let your dog

sniff, explore, and enjoy the experience—but keep it balanced so you're not stopping every five feet. If you're walking for a client, follow their preferences regarding pace, route, and time.

8. Handle Conflicts Calmly

If another dog walker (or passerby) complains or has a concern, try to stay calm and respectful. Not everyone is a dog lover, and addressing concerns with empathy often diffuses tension.

9. Leave No Trace

Beyond picking up after your dog, don't litter, damage trails, or leave food or toys behind. A clean, respectable presence helps keep public spaces open and dog-friendly.

In Conclusion

Dog walking can be a relaxing, joyful routine—or a stressful experience, depending on how it's handled. Practicing good dog walker etiquette helps protect your dog, promotes positive interactions, and builds a better community for everyone.

After all, being a good neighbor starts with being a responsible pet parent.

Dear Spring Valley Lake Resident,

We're excited to announce preparations for this year's Firework Show and share an important update that will enhance the event experience for our community.

In a positive change for 2025, the pyrotechnics team will no longer be staging from East Beach. Instead, thanks to the generosity of a neighboring property owner, SVLA will be using vacant lots on Sea Gull Drive exclusively for the storage, preparation, and loading of fireworks onto the barge. This adjustment allows us to reclaim valuable space at East Beach, making more room available for residents to enjoy the show from one of our most popular viewing areas.

As always, the fireworks themselves will be launched from the SVLA barge, positioned in the center of the lake, ensuring a safe and spectacular show visible from all sides of the shoreline.
