

C o v i n g R e p a i r Update

An Executive Board meeting took place on Thursday, January, 5, 2023 @ 6:00 PM via ZOOM.

The Board of Directors have approved and will finalize contracts with Victorville Concrete for work on 17 lots, and LPC Inc. for work on Fishing Area #7 and 3 lots.

SVLA's maintenance team will be completing coving work on approximately 20 lots

Unforeseen weather may postpone the estimated completion date.

The work should be completed approximately 45 days after approval. It will take approximately 90 days to fill our lake back to normal.

The coving repair project will have an estimated total cost of \$746,000.

We will send out more information as it becomes available.

Happy New Year!! Here we are at the beginning of a new year. Our department is kicking off the new year with jumping into the coving repairs. While a lot of the coving repairs are going to be contracted out, we will still be completing some repairs in-house. Along with the coving repairs, we are finalizing and preparing for Phase 1 of the dock replacement. We are heading into the year full force. Look below to see what else we have been up to.

Beach Area:

- Sanitizing picnic tables and playground equipment daily
- Cut grass
- Removed broken tree branch from East Beach



Lake Filtration Systems:

Administration & Lake Management

We are so excited to be entering a new year which will bring with it new projects and new challenges. We are happy to see the finalization of the lake coving contract negotiating and will begin to see the work started soon. We have a short time frame to work with, but we are doing our best to stay as close to the proposed schedule as possible.

Our original projection was for the lake to be back at normal level by May 7, 2023. We will be sure to keep the community updated to any chang-

es as we get closer to completing the project.

The most critical 20 lots were chosen for repairs and will be contracted out. The owners of these lots have all been contacted. Approximately 20 additional lots were chosen for Phase 2 of the coving repairs. These repairs will be handled in house and are not as extensive as the repairs that will be contracted out.

We have also finalized the contract for Phase 1 of the dock replacement and are excited to see those come together. The vendor has already begun to order supplies and will begin building the dock frames. Once the frames are built, they will transport the materials on site and begin assembling and installing. You should be seeing these going into the water early spring.



Another year has come and gone and it's time to welcome the new year, full of resolutions, to be even better than we were the year before. With that in mind, we encourage all the residents who want to make a change to the outside of their home to submit an Architectural application to our office so you can start making those changes. If you need assistance with your application, we are happy to go over any issues that may arise. Please make an appointment through the SVLA website or you can submit it to us by email at Architecture@svla.com. In the last year the community completed nearly a thousand projects and started around seven hundred more; and we love seeing your home change to match your vision. There are some homes in our community that still need a little work. We are aware of these issues and are taking steps to rectify these issues. We can't give information about homes that don't belong to you,

but if you are concerned that we missed something, please call us at 760-245-9756 and we will update you as much as we are legally allowed to.

The Lake is lower than we have ever had it, so if you want to make repairs on your own coving, now is the time to submit an application to make those repairs. This lowering only happens every two years so now is the time to take advantage of the lowered levels. There are very specific requirements that are needed ensure the longevity of the repairs which we will go over with you when you submit your application.

We saw many homes with wonderful Christmas decorations, and we thought that these homes did an amazing job with their decorations. As a reminder, please remember to remove all exterior holiday decorations by January 25. All of us from the Association are wishing the community a wonderful New Year full of fun, family, and friends.

Water Leaks and Frozen Pipes

Hello Spring Valley Lake residents. During the colder months the Public Safety Department receives many calls regarding water leaks due to broken sprinkler pipes. If the temperature of your pipes drops below 32 degrees, even for a short period, you run the risk of a pipe fracture or worse. Underground sprinkler piping is usually insulated from freezing temperatures by soil. Valves and piping that supplies water to them are generally above ground and are the most likely places to find a leak. Try these suggestions to minimize your chances of a broken pipe.

- If you have an automatic system, then you can “shut down” the controller (timer). Most controllers have a “rain mode” which

simply shuts off the signals to the valves.

- Disconnect and store garden hoses. If your home has a separate shut-off for external faucets, turn it off and drain the water from those faucets.

- Above ground piping needs to be insulated. Self-sticking foam insulating tape or foam insulating tubes are commonly found at home supply stores and are relatively inexpensive.

- If you have a gardener or a lawn service company, talk to them about winterizing your above ground irrigation pipes.

If you are out in the community and notice a water leak at a property, please report it to the Public Safety Department (760 245-6400).



California leads the nation in the number of Catalytic Converter thefts. Catalytic converters are required to make your vehicle run properly, and it is illegal to drive without one. It only takes a few minutes for a thief to remove a catalytic converter from your vehicle and they can sell it for a profit.

Here are some ways to prevent catalytic converter theft:

- Park in garages or well-lit areas at home
- Calibrate your vehicle alarm so vibration detection sets it off
- Consider installing motion

sensor flood lights and video surveillance around garages and driveways

- Have your catalytic converter etched with your VIN or plate number

- Consider installing a catalytic converter lock

Please be vigilant. Thefts are occurring day and night. If you see suspicious activity, or hear unusual sawing or grinding sounds, please report it to the San Bernardino County Sheriff Department at 760-956-5001 and the Public Safety Department at 760-245-6400.

Radiofrequency Ablation Considerably Lessens Back Pain

DEAR DR. ROACH: I suffered a lower back injury in 2001, with crushed and bulging discs in the L2, L3, L4 and L5 vertebrae. After over a year of physical therapy and drugs, my pain doctor tried an epidural injection, which did not work, and then suggested I try something new at that time called a radiofrequency ablation (also called a lumbar facet rhizotomy). It's done as an outpatient surgery and may have to be repeated.

I've done so many that I opt for no anesthesia. It works great; I even get up and drive myself home! I've learned to limit my activities, so as to not cause more damage due to my disabled pain receptors.

I have been pain- and drug-free for almost 20 years. The treatment usually lasts nine to 14 months, and when I feel the nerves starting to fire again and cause me pain, I just schedule the procedure and have them ablated again.

Whenever I see somebody walking funny due to back pain, I mention this procedure to them. Several of them have come back and thanked me for saying something.

Doctors don't seem to promote this procedure, and I don't understand why. It's clearly another option besides surgery and addictive medi-

cation. It's been a win-win for me, as opposed to surgery.

Please help promote this wonderful yet "unknown" procedure. I'm still living an active normal life at 64, 20 years after I was told I may end up in a wheelchair. — M.T.

ANSWER: Radiofrequency ablation of the nerves in the back has been used since the 1970s in people with intractable back pain. The procedure uses an electrode that heats the nerves in the facet joints of the back, stopping pain conduction. This is done when the treating physician is sure that the pain is coming from these particular nerves, called the lumbar medial branch nerves. This procedure is not appropriate for all types of back pain. Typically, the physician will perform a block using an injection, and if this is successful, but short-lived (as is often the case), a radiofrequency ablation is considered.

When it works, a year of relief is typical (sometimes shorter or, for a few, up to three years) before the nerve fibers regenerate, at which point the procedure can be repeated. Burning or numbness around the injection site is the most common adverse effect.

Effectiveness rates in the published literature range from 50% to nearly 100% in small trials of carefully chosen subjects. However, a large randomized trial of this procedure in subjects who were being treated with an exercise program and psychological support did not show a significant improvement in pain or function.

I agree with you that this procedure is safer than surgery, and while I'm glad it's worked for you, the evidence of benefit from the highest-quality trials is lacking.

Celebrate the New Year With Grapefruit Baked Alaska

Greet the new year with a showy, wintry dessert your family will "ooh" and "ahh" over. It's a take on traditional Baked Alaska that you may enjoy at fancy restaurants. This mini version is much easier, using fresh grapefruit in its own "bowl" instead of cake, but still keeps the wow factor with billowing warm meringue on top and chilly ice cream nestled inside.

Timing is everything. Do some simple prep work beforehand. Then, as the table is being cleared after your main course, preheat the oven and whip the egg whites while your child spoons fruit into the grapefruit bowls and tops each one with ice cream and mounds of sweet meringue.

GRAPEFRUIT BAKED ALASKA

- Makes 6 servings
- 4 grapefruits
 - 6 scoops vanilla ice cream
 - 3 egg whites (1/2 cup) at room temperature
 - 1/4 teaspoon cream of tartar
 - 1/2 cup sugar
 - 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract

One hour or more before serving:

1. Prepare grapefruit by cutting evenly in half crosswise. Use a grapefruit knife to cut out fruit sections. Place in a bowl and drain juice (enjoy drinking it for a snack). If grapefruit is rather tart, add some sugar. Cover and refrigerate.

2. Remove and discard membranes in six of the halves to form hollow "bowls," and discard the two remaining grapefruit

halves. (You are using 6 halves for the dessert, but the fruit from 4 grapefruits to have ample servings.)

3. Pre-scoop ice cream in six rounds on a tray lined with wax paper or plastic wrap. Place back in freezer.

15 minutes before serving:

1. Heat oven to 400 degrees F. Line baking sheet with parchment paper or foil. Ask one of your kids to spoon the refrigerated grapefruit pieces evenly into the six grapefruit "bowls" and set them on the baking sheet.

2. In a mixing bowl, beat the egg whites with an electric mixer set at low speed until frothy and foamy. Add the cream of tartar. Increase speed until soft peaks form. Start adding the sugar slowly, a tablespoon at a time. Let your kids watch as the mixture changes and enlarges, and glossy, stiff peaks form.

3. Set an ice-cream round in the center of each fruit-filled bowl. Immediately spoon the glossy, stiff meringue on top and seal edges around the cut grapefruit rim with a butter knife. Bake in the middle of the oven for 5 minutes, or until meringue is golden.



4. Serve immediately on dessert plates.

Tip: For a special occasion such as New Year's Eve, top each one with a birthday candle and light.

NOTE: Use pasteurized eggs, if you prefer.





