



Coving Consultant Report

As most of you are aware, the Board of Directors enlisted the services of a consulting company to evaluate the state of our lake coving. This report provided us with various options and cost estimates for the necessary repairs. It's important to emphasize that this consultant's report is stored as an association record, accessible to any homeowner upon request. You can obtain a copy of the report by contacting the association or visiting our office. Due to its size, we will provide digital copies for your convenience. Additionally, we have compiled a timeline and history log of our associations coving to ensure that all residents have access to this information. I want to be sure that all residents are disclosed all available information. Please keep in mind that this document is our initial draft, and we will update it as new information becomes available.

Some residents have been circulating incorrect information, suggesting that the Board and staff are not sharing information or have something to hide. This couldn't be further from the truth. We want to assure you that the Board and Lake Committee are collaborating to create a comprehensive plan, ensuring that we are all well-informed about our next steps. As soon as we have more information, we will share it. We will also make sure to post this information on our website and keep it updated. If you have any questions, please feel free to reach out to me, and I will connect you with our Lake Manager.

Reserve Study

By now, every homeowner should have received a disclosure packet, which includes information about the reserve study. If you've reviewed the projected percentage funded for the next three years, you may understandably have concerns. Our team will be conducting a final review of the reserve study before November 1st, 2023. During this review, we will consider several components of the study that we believe can have their useful life extended. We will provide a detailed list of all changes and send out email notifications to residents interested in reviewing the updated reserve study.

It's important to note that the yearly contributions to the reserve study will remain the same, as the board has already approved the budget. Furthermore, we have discussed the possibility of extending coving repairs to every three years instead of every two years. This adjustment will grant us additional time to save, plan, communicate, and improve our percentage funded. Typically, with a multi-million-dollar budget, there will be a favorable variance after the audit. I strongly recommend to the board that we allocate any excess funds towards the reserve study. With a few adjustments and the payoff of the water loan, I am confident that our percentage funded will see a significant increase.

Accounting Practices

Taking into account feedback from our members and insights from my colleagues in large-scale management across the country, I am

proposing a change in our monthly financial procedures. For over a decade, our accounting services company has conducted a soft close of the monthly financials, reserving the hard close for the end of our fiscal year. While the soft close involves most of the same entries as a hard close, it leaves the monthly books open for adjustments and bills that may emerge after the board package is prepared.

Our goal is that starting from November 1st, 2023, we implement a hard close each month. Any necessary adjustments will be disclosed in

a monthly variance report. I understand that this change will require adjustments from our staff and our accounting firm, and I appreciate your understanding and cooperation in making this transition.

I would like to extend my gratitude to the residents who have provided valuable suggestions. It is through your feedback that we can make positive changes to benefit our communities' perception of financial transparency. Please know that your input is highly valued and essential to our ongoing success.

LAKE COVING DISCLOSURE

1997: SVLA Sued by Homeowner for damage to concrete coving

- A homeowner sued the Association for damages to the concrete coving of the lake behind his property. The Judge ruled that SVLA is responsible for the cost of the repairs and was charged with the responsibility to create a timetable and methodology to resolve the problem/damage.

January 2019

- Lake lowered 24" to complete coving repairs.
- 85 Lots received repairs- All work was completed in house

January 2021

- Lake lowered 24" to complete coving repairs
- 90 Lots received repairs- All work was completed in house

June 2022

- The SVLA Board began discussing the upcoming coving repairs. In previous years, lowering the lake by 24" did not allow for enough exposure of shoreline to gain a full understanding of how extensive the damage was.
- The SVLA Board made the decision to lower the lake greater than 24", the coming year, to be able to do a more comprehensive assessment of the damage.
- The Board Agreed to lower the lake a total of 60".

January 2023

- Lake lowered 60" to complete coving repairs
- The following work was completed:
 - 16 Lots received repairs by Victorville Concrete
 - Victorville Concrete operates under the Contractor License of Goff Construction
 - 4 Lots received repairs by LPC
 - 20 lots received repairs by SVLA Operations Department

January 2023

- SVLA Board began searching for a Lake consultant to do a comprehensive study of the erosion damage, in hopes to find a solution to the problem.

February 2023

- SVLA Board contracts with Genterra Consultants Inc. to conduct the study.

May 2023

- Genterra Consultants Inc. submitted the final report of their findings.
- Genterra's report includes various options to repair the existing damage, which include both short term and long term repair options.

The short term options are as follows:

1. Short-Term Alternative No. ST-1-Option 1: Soil-Cement Liner 12 Inches Thick

Cost: Starting at \$8,292,129

2. Short-Term Alternative No. ST-1-Option 2: Soil-Cement Liner 12 Inches Thick with 10-foot-Deep Sheet Pile Cutoff and Reinforced Concrete Cap Beam

Cost: Starting at \$43,870,508

3. Short-Term Alternative No. ST-2-Option 1: Gabion Mattress 12 Inches Thick

Cost: Starting at \$19,870,741

4. Short-Term Alternative No. ST-2-Option 2: Gabion Mattress 12 Inches Thick with 10-foot Deep Sheet Pile Cutoff and Reinforced Concrete Cap Beam

Cost: Starting at \$48,692,360

The Long Term options are as follows:

1. Long-Term Alternative No. LT-1: Reinforced Concrete Liner with 10-foot Deep Sheet Pile Cutoff and Reinforced Concrete Cap Beam

Cost: Starting at \$71,507,360

2. Long-Term Alternative No. LT-2: Reinforced Concrete Liner with 10-foot Deep Concrete Key

Cost: Starting at \$70,348,929

August 2023

- The SVLA Board increased the Reserve amount for the lake coving from \$170,000 to \$1,000,000. These extra funds will allow us to correct more damage on our next round of repairs.
- The SVLA Board made the decision to have the lake coving useful life extended to 3 years, instead of 2, to allow for the reserve to accumulate additional funds to allocate toward the repairs.

September 2023

- The lake committee is currently reviewing the lake consultant report from Genterra Consultants Inc. and will be providing their recommendations to the Board.

Happy October! Soon enough I will be saying Merry Christmas and Happy New Year. What a crazy fast year it has been...

it completed. Once the LPO is completed we can then schedule to have the fuel pump reinstalled.

Last month, we had the floating islands moved to their designated areas. We also performed a bit of maintenance on them once they were moved, to keep them healthy and looking good

The gates on the new docks have been completed and installed. They both are equipped with a touch pad lock, which we are hoping will make accessing the slips easier by only having to enter a code, rather than carry a key with you. We have Ramco docks making some adjustments to them, to ensure they are more secure, but they are in and functioning great. We are still waiting on the permit from San Bernardino County for the Lake Patrol Office (LPO). County did notify that they needed a proof of ownership document submitted before completing the permit. We are hoping that once the necessary documents are submitted things will move quickly to have

We have had our team building the remainder of the gates, for the aerator containments at the Fishing areas. This requires for our team to weld the gates together and then send them off to be powder coated. You will start seeing them being installed shortly.

We have contacted our vendor and placed our order for our trout stocking. Due to us not being able to complete the fish stocking last season, due to the lake lowering, we are able to use those funds along with this year's funds to be able to do a larger stocking than usual. We will be receiving a total of 12,000 pounds following

October is here, and you know what that means! It's time to bust out the spooky, scary skeletons because it's officially time to decorate for fall and Halloween in Spring Valley Lake. Residents are encouraged to be creative and conjure up all kinds of decorations, but anything with profanity or crude language will not be permitted. The Code Enforcement Department employees want to remind residents all other seasonal Halloween decorations must be removed 30 days after Halloween.

Annual inspections are still underway, and Code Enforcement officers will be checking for violations on the front of all properties and the back of properties residing on the lake, golf course, river-

walk and equestrian side. Weeds and yellowing grass are common violations spotted as the weather cools down, so pay extra close attention to your landscaping.

Cooler weather also provides ample opportunities to begin any exterior projects that were not ideal to begin during the summer months. Please remember architectural applications must be submitted and approved before any changes are made to the residence. Code Enforcement officers would be happy to answer any questions regarding architectural projects.
