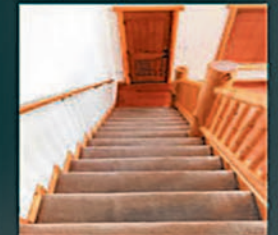

They work hard every day to ensure that the needs of the Association are being addressed and that we continue serving our community members with professionalism and care. I also want to recognize the work that went into preparing for the June 27 fireworks show. By the time this article is published, the event will have already taken place, and I hope everyone has had an opportunity to enjoy it. A successful event of this size does not happen because of one person or one department. It requires coordination, planning, and teamwork from every department. Another important area of focus has been lake maintenance. Our maintenance team is working diligently to stay on top of lake-related concerns, with assistance and input from the Lake Committee and the Lake Task Force. Their involvement is appreciated as we continue reviewing both immediate and long-term maintenance needs for the lake.

This year, the Association will begin lowering the lake on **September 1, 2026**. The purpose of lowering the lake is to allow for a comprehensive review and inspection of the lake liner and coving. The Association has requested multiple companies to participate in this process and provide evaluations and estimates for any repairs that may be necessary. In anticipation of the findings, the Association has developed an action plan to address any repair needs identified during the inspection process, including those that may require immediate attention.

For those who live on the lake, it is very important that all boats, vessels, and related lake equipment are removed as required during this process. This will also be an ideal time for owners to inspect their docks, boat supports, lifts, and related components to determine whether

Please note that any proposed modifications, repairs, replacements, or improvements to docks, lifts, boat supports, or other structures may require prior Architectural Control Committee (ACC) review and approval before work begins. Owners are encouraged to contact the Association office to determine applicable requirements before commencing any project.

Spring Valley Lake is a beauti-

ful community, and maintaining it properly requires planning, communication, and cooperation. I appreciate the opportunity to work with the Board, staff, committees, and membership as we continue moving forward together.

A New Barge for Our Community

Working on an ambitious timeline of approximately two to three weeks, our Maintenance Team designed and constructed a new barge that incorporates aluminum into its

structure, providing increased durability and longevity. Their hard work and craftsmanship ensured the project was completed in time for this year's fireworks display, allowing our community tradition to continue uninterrupted.

The new barge will continue to play a vital role in supporting our annual Fourth of July fireworks show for years to come. In addition, it will serve as a valuable resource throughout the year by helping transport materials and equipment around the lake whenever needed.

With an expected lifespan of 10 years or more, this investment will benefit our community well into the future.

East Beach Gets a Refresh

As part of our ongoing efforts to maintain and enhance our community amenities, the Maintenance Team recently completed a sand replenishment project at East Beach.

Over time, weather, water activity, and regular use can naturally reduce the amount of sand along the shoreline. To refresh the area and keep East Beach looking its best, our team added approximately 25 tons of new sand to the beach.

The addition of fresh sand not only improves the appearance of the shoreline but also helps create a more comfortable and enjoyable space for residents and visitors to relax, play, and enjoy the lake throughout the summer season.

We appreciate the hard work of our Maintenance Team in complet-

ing this project and helping maintain one of our community's favorite recreational areas. Be sure to give them a wave or a word of thanks when you see them around the neighborhood—their efforts help make special community events and everyday operations possible.

It is also an excellent opportunity to reflect on how each resident contributes to the appearance, safety, and overall quality of life within our Association. The warm weather and longer days provide ideal conditions for outdoor maintenance. Keeping properties well-maintained not only enhances neighborhood appearance, but also helps preserve property values throughout the community. Residents are encouraged to regularly inspect their properties for overgrown weeds and vegetation, dead or dying landscaping, exterior maintenance needs such as peeling paint or damaged fencing, debris accumulation and improper storage of materials, and tree branches that may obstruct roadways, sidewalks, or visibility at intersections

Summer is also a popular time

for construction and exterior improvement projects. Whether you are considering new landscaping, patio covers, fencing, roofing, solar installations, or exterior painting, please remember that projects on the exterior of the home require Architectural Review Committee approval before work begins. Submitting complete applications with detailed plans, color selections, and supporting documentation can significantly reduce processing times and help avoid unnecessary delays. Residents are encouraged to review Association guidelines and submit applications well in advance of planned project start dates. As we enjoy the summer season, I want to thank our residents for their continued cooperation and commitment to maintaining the high standards that make our community a desirable place to live. The efforts made by homeowners, volunteers, committee members, and staff collectively contribute to the success of our Association and the beauty of our community.

Stay Safe This Summer: Recognizing and Responding to Heat-Related Illnesses

As temperatures continue to rise during the summer months, residents are encouraged to take precautions and remain aware of the dangers associated with excessive heat exposure. Heat-related illnesses can develop quickly and become life-threatening if not recognized and treated promptly.

Heat-related illnesses are progressive conditions caused by prolonged exposure to high temperatures. When identified in their early stages, most heat-related emergencies can be reversed. However, if left untreated, they may progress to heat stroke, a severe and potentially fatal medical emergency.

Types of Heat-Related Illnesses

Heat Cramps

Heat cramps are the mildest form of heat-related illness and are often the first sign that the body is struggling to cope with excessive heat. They are characterized by painful muscle spasms, typically affecting the legs and abdomen.

Heat Exhaustion

Heat exhaustion occurs when the body's cooling system becomes overwhelmed and can no longer effectively regulate internal temperature. Common signs and symptoms include:

- Cool, moist, pale, ashen, or flushed skin

- Headache, nausea, or dizziness
- Weakness and fatigue
- Heavy sweating

Without proper treatment, heat exhaustion can progress to heat stroke.

Heat Stroke

Heat stroke is the most severe form of heat-related illness and occurs when the body's temperature-regulating systems fail. It is a life-threatening emergency that requires immediate medical attention. Signs and symptoms of heat stroke may include:

- Changes in level of consciousness
- Hot skin that may be wet or dry
- Red or pale skin appearance
- Vision disturbances
- Seizures
- Vomiting
- Rapid, shallow breathing
- Rapid, weak pulse
- Absence of sweating

Treatment and First Aid

If someone is suffering from a heat-related illness, take the following steps immediately:

1. Move the person to a cool or shaded location.
2. Loosen or remove tight and perspiration-soaked clothing.
3. Cool the individual by spraying them with cool water or applying cool, wet towels to the skin.
4. Fan the person to increase cooling.

5. If the person is conscious and able to swallow, encourage them to drink small amounts of a commercial sports drink, coconut water, or milk. If none of these are available, provide water.

When to Call for Emergency Medical Services

If the person refuses fluids, begins vomiting, experiences a change in mental status, has vision disturbances, or suffers a seizure:

- Call 911 or summon Emergency Medical Services (EMS) immediately.
- Begin rapid cooling measures as quickly as possible.
- If safe to do so, immerse the individual up to the neck in cold water.
- Alternatively, cover the body with ice-water-soaked towels, replacing them frequently to maintain cooling.
- Apply ice packs or bags of ice

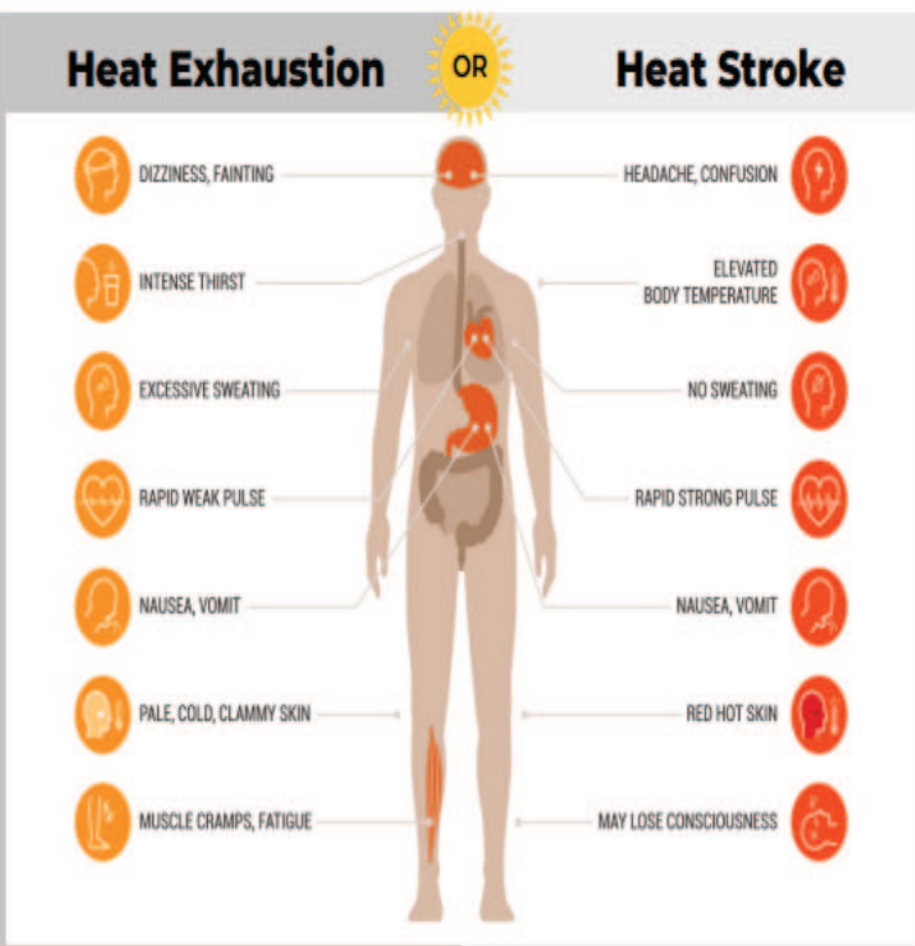
over the towels if available.

If you are unable to monitor the person's temperature, continue rapid cooling efforts for up to 20 minutes, until the individual's condition improves, or until EMS personnel arrive. Continue to provide care for any additional medical conditions as needed.

Prevention Is Key

During periods of extreme heat, stay hydrated, limit strenuous outdoor activities during peak afternoon temperatures, wear lightweight clothing, and seek shade or air-conditioned environments whenever possible. By recognizing the warning signs early and taking immediate action, heat-related illnesses can often be prevented from becoming serious medical emergencies.

Stay informed, stay hydrated, and stay safe this summer.



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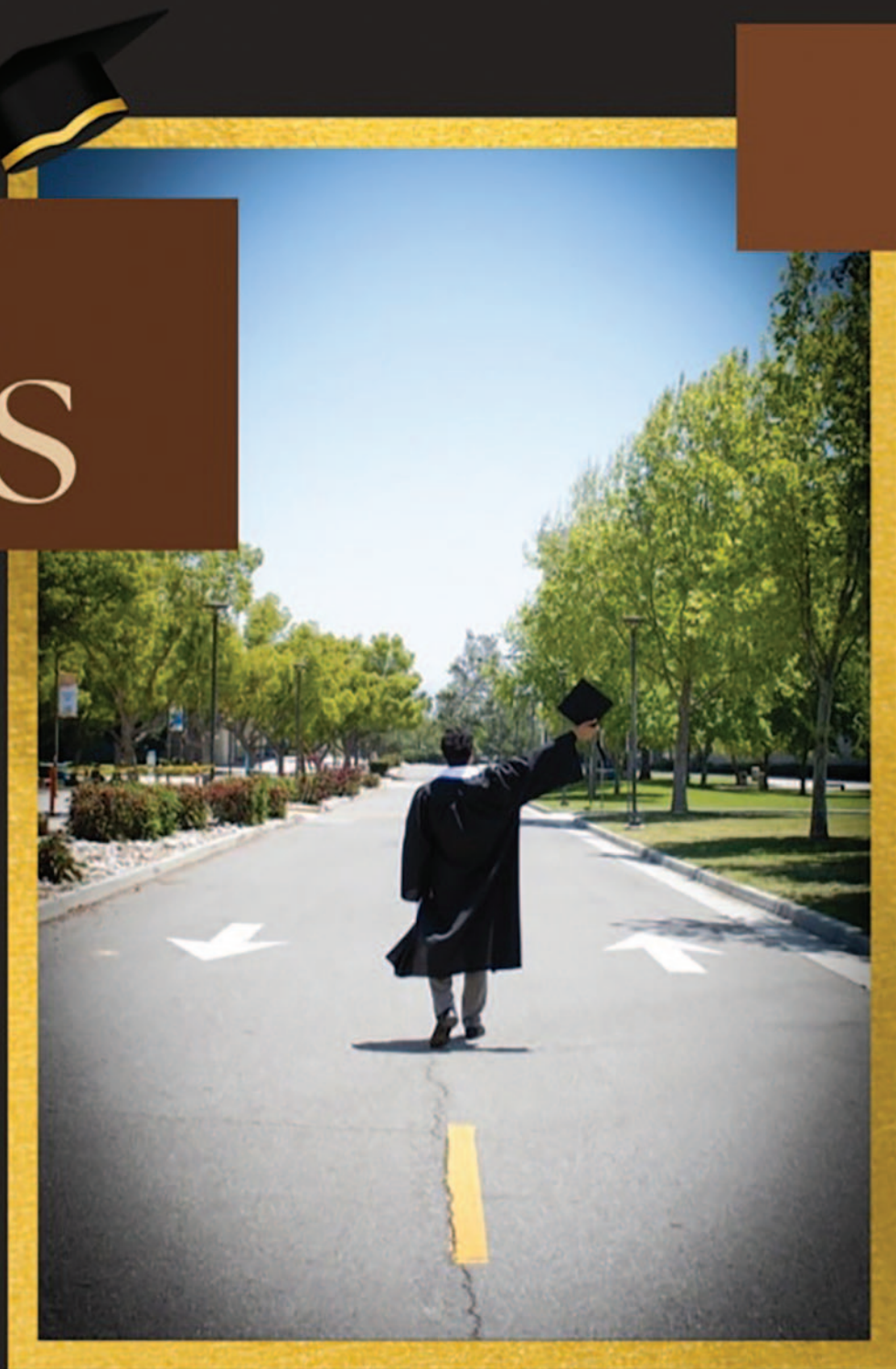
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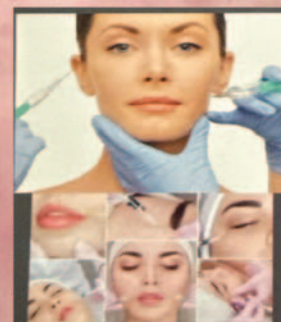
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EQUESTRIAN ESTATES COMMITTEE

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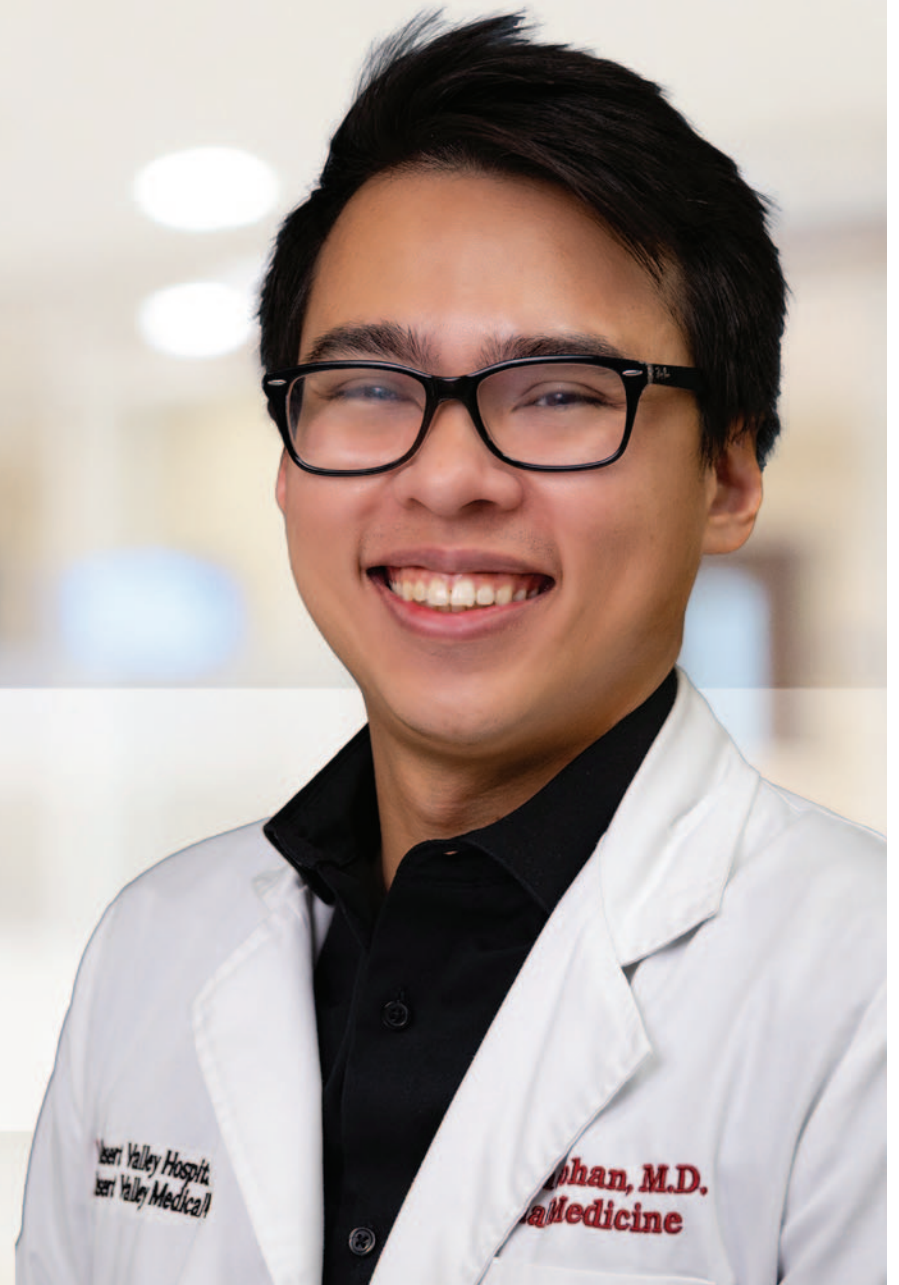
